

The alleged plentitude of bootleggers and scaplet women in North Platte is being used by the Maxwell Telepost and the Sutherland Courier as a club to defeat the new court house proposition. While there are bootleggers and scaplet women in North Platte as there are in every town of similar size the country over, the conditions are not such as to brand North Platte a hell-hole such as these two papers apparently desire to convey to their readers. We believe that the average resident of the county will agree with us that the injection of a moral question into a court house proposition is rather far-fetched, and has no bearing whatever on the question as to whether Lincoln county does or does not need a new court house. A new building is not any more a North Platte need than a Lincoln county need; every owner of land in the county is interested in the preservation of the records; every one who visits the court house will agree with us that every officer in the building is handicapped by lack of room and conveniences for transacting business; and we believe that the progressive farmers of Lincoln county realizing the need of a new building will not vote against the proposition because of the charge that North Platte officials are lax in their efforts to prosecute law breakers or to drive out undesirable citizens.

GERMANY INCREASED STOCK OF GOLD DURING WAR

Germany increased her stock of gold during the war but lost \$123,000,000 between January 1 and May 7 of this year, according to information obtained by the federal reserve board. This loss was due to reparations made Belgium and Rumania for gold stolen from those countries and by shipments to neutral countries, for food.

Beginning with \$298,000,000 in gold at the outbreak of the war, the German reicksbank increased its metal to \$525,000,000 at the end of 1918.

The federal reserve banks of this country and the Bank of England increased their holdings of gold, but the Bank of France and the Bank of Italy showed decreases.

Nebraska's Grain Yield.

The estimated yield of small grain in Nebraska is not holding up as the harvest progresses. It was stated several weeks ago that the crop would be the heaviest the state had ever known, but the hot weather the latter part of June was somewhat disastrous, causing the berry to shrivel.

Speaking of the exaggerated estimates made a couple of weeks before harvest the Omaha Bee says: "Now we are told that spring wheat will not exceed 12,141,000 bushels and that winter wheat will only reach 7,725,000 bushels. If these figures turn out eventually to be correct, it will give Nebraska the biggest wheat crop it ever set to market. Spring wheat seldom has gone above 10,000,000 bushels, and the winter variety usually returns something less than 60,000,000. Therefore, the only great 'loss' so far sustained is in the difference between the early and unjustifiable estimates and the grain that actually comes from the field."

A rain which was reported by the weather bureau as ninety-seven one hundredths of an inch fell Sunday evening. Apparently the rain covered quite an area of country north and west and extended over south, but railroad men say that east of Gannett but little rain fell.

PRESIDENT VETOES BILL KILLING DAYLIGHT LAW.

Last Saturday President Wilson vetoed the agricultural bill because of the clause which abolished the daylight saving act, which was passed March 9th, 1918.

President Wilson stated that the abolition of the daylight saving law would be a grave inconvenience, and not only a grave inconvenience, but would involve a serious economic loss. He said that the law was passed after a thorough study of conditions all over the United States by economic experts. He also called attention to the "happy consequences" which had followed the passage of this law in other countries where it had been in operation for some time—stressing the economy of fuel and energy required for making artificial light, and the greater efficiency of work done in daylight hours.
