Does Not Look Like a Man Who Had Been Through Threshing Machine.

Conyers denies all knowledge of the letter received here containing the account of his death and says he is at a loss to know who could have written it.

Conyers succeeded in effecting a reconciliation with his wife yesterday and it is understood that the divorce proceedings will be dropped.

General German Saengerfest was held at Wursburg in Bavaria, and in the year 1862 the "General German Saengerbund" was founded at Coburg.

For many years the necessity had made itself felt that the North American Saengerbund organization be made stronger and permanent.

There were present at this gathering the Saengerfest board, prepared to incorporate under the name of the Thirty-first Saengerfest association, and established headquarters in rooms 315 and 316, Wainwright building.

Program All Arranged.

The program of the coming festival has already been properly arranged. It will be both in English and German.

There will be a reception concert the first evening in which the orchestra and male choruses will participate, and also solos and grand mixed choruses, the latter in English.

The following afternoon there will be a matinee, with orchestra, solos, children's choruses in English and choruses of American societies. In addition there will be two grand evening concerts.

The musical committee is endeavoring to secure a quartet of solo singers of not only national, but international reputation.

There were present at this gathering three singing societies from Cincinnati, a society from Madison, Ind., the Liederkranz from Louisville, Ky., and a delegation of the Columbus Maennerchor, Columbus, O.

On account of the great extension of the country and the poor accommodations for traveling—the New York & Erie railroad did not reach Dunkirk before 1851, and the Baltimore & Ohio did not reach Wheeling before 1853—the foundation of several associations or unions of singers became necessary.
