All Products Rise Weak and Close Lower on Board of Trade

WHEAT BROKERS AWAIT CROP REPORT

Corn and Oats Suffer and Provisions Are Also Affected Both by Liberal Hog Receipts and Grain Conditions.

CHICAGO, May 11.—The wheat market was a dull affair today, due to general bearish news and July closed lower. July corn was up 1/4, with oats down 1/4. Provisions closed from 1/4 to 1/2 lower.

Trading in the wheat pit was exceedingly dull, the greater part of the day being spent by operators in disposing of remaining contracts, awaiting the issuance of the government crop report.

Under these influences there was quite general selling by commission houses and local bears, and with little support the market declined still further.

The weakness in the wheat market was checked by buying through brokers by the leading operators, but the absence of any outside influence caused a bearish sentiment in the pit.

Local receipts for the three ports of 24 cars, against 27 last week, and 264 a year ago.

Corn was quiet and while prices were fairly steady early in the session, the general dullness later resulted in an easier feeling.

The weakness in the corn market was checked by local traders on the increased receipts and no effort was made to support the market.
