More Cash Deposited by Nebraska People Than Ever Before.

EASTERN STRINGENCY NOT SHOWN HERE

Supreme Court Reverses Verdict Against Accident Association, Holding Man Committed Suicide.

From a Staff Correspondent. LINCOLN, Oct. 8.—(Special.)—Again have the deposits in the Nebraska state banks reached a new high mark.

The reserve at this time is 36 1/2 per cent, one-third of 1 per cent less than it was at the time of the September report last year.
