FIGHTS ON ELECTION DAY

Two Killed and Two Wounded at Polling Place in Virginia. CANDIDATE FOR SHERIFF KILLS JUDGE Election Officer and Republican Candidate-Fight in Streets of Louisville with Fatal Results.

BRISTOL, Tenn., Nov. 3.-A fatal election row occurred in the polling place at Fairview, in Scott county, Va., today. Two men were killed and two others wounded, one fatally. The dead: JOHN OSBORNE, ZEKIEL NICHOLS, J. H. Catron, shot through the neck, will die.

Two Dead, Three Wounded. LAKE VILLAGE, Ark., Nov. 3.-Two people are dead and three wounded as the result of trouble between whites and blacks here today, which was not settled until a lynching had quelled the excited people. The dead: FRANK ANDERSON, white, Lake Village, killed in a fight. HENRY JOHNSON, a negro, lynched. The wounded are: B. Vinson, white, a lawyer of Little Rock; Joseph Frame, white, of Lake Village; Ella McDowell, colored.


