SAYS LOUISVILLE MAN HAS GRIEVANCE

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo., Jan. 16.—(Special Telegram.)—T. F. Burns, owner of the Colorado Springs Western league base ball franchise, has returned to this city. He admitted the truth of all newspaper reports regarding his new alliance with Tebeau and claims that Messrs. Packard, Bourke and others misrepresented matters to him, and that he was formerly a party to the plan to oust Tebeau since that time, he claims, he had made discoveries that place Packard and Bourke in a bad light, and it is simply a question of honor with him to see Tebeau secure what he considers his rights. Mr. Burns expects to return to Lincoln on Sunday to attend the injunction proceedings brought by Tebeau to restrain the Western league managers from meeting without admitting Tebeau to the conference.
