NEBRASKA CROPS BOOMING

Condition of Growing Fields Improved by Rain and Sun.

PASTURES IN EXCELLENT FIX

Fewer Potato Bugs Reported Than at This Season for Several Years—Cherries Are Looking All Right.

Crops are booming in Nebraska.

That is the gist of the weekly crop and soil report of the Burlington road made to G. W. Holdrege, general manager.

Rainfall has been abundant and general. The average crop in the Omaha division, 24 per cent; Lincoln division, 26 per cent; Wyoming division, 22 per cent; and Cook division, 23 per cent.

Spring wheat and oats give promise of an average yield. While the corn crop is reported a little late, it is every where in most excellent condition for this season of the year.

Sugar beets are in good condition without exception. Meadows and pastures are in excellent condition and the first crop of alfalfa is being cut.

Pastures had a late start, but the last few weeks of rain have put them in splendid condition.

The season is a few potato bugs than at this season during previous years and the potatoes are doing well.

Cherries are ripening and the prospects for all small fruit are very good.

Peaches undoubtedly will be a short crop. Wheat around Sidney is reported to be 25 per cent better than at this season last year.

Oats and wheat are good all over Wyoming and corn has made good progress.

Sheep shearing is on to full capacity of the Sheridan division.

Mysterious Boat Not for Castro

Government Finds Vessels Belong to Venezuela and Calls Off Guard.

WASHINGTON, June 16.—State department official advised from Venezuela today cleared up the mystery of the steamer Nanticoke and tug Dispatch, suspected of filibustering, showing they were purchased by Venezuela.

The Department of Justice agents have been in North Carolina investigating the status of the Nanticoke and the Dispatch. The state department advised, saying the two vessels had been bought by Venezuela.

The vessels are for duty on Lake Maracaibo under the government navigation service.

On receipt of these advices, Assistant Secretary McIlroy of the Department of Commerce and Labor telegraphed to the collectors of ports on the middle Atlantic coast to grant clearance papers to the Nanticoke and Dispatch.

LAW HURTS MARRIAGE TRADE

Requirement of Year Before Re-marrying, Stops Many Colorado Couples.

CHEYENNE, Wyo., June 16.—(Special.)—The number of marriages of Colorado couples has fallen off nearly 50 per cent since the new Wyoming law requiring that divorcees shall be separated at least a year before they can marry in this state, went into effect.

A year ago the marriage statistics in Colorado showed that 1,200 couples were married during the month of May, but during April and May of this year the total will not aggregate ten couples.

Big Gathering of Sioux. SIOUX FALLS, S. D., June 16.—(Special.)—What is expected to be one of the most notable and most novel gatherings of Sioux Indians held in South Dakota for some years will be held July 26 at the mouth of Medicine creek, on the Lower Brule reservation.

The Sioux Indians of several reservations are making elaborate preparations for the big gathering of red men. Rev. Luke Walker, an educated Indian of the Lower Brule reservation and a clergyman of the Episcopal church of South Dakota, has charge of the arrangements.

The gathering will be largely of a religious character, but nevertheless sport will be indulged in quite profusely.
