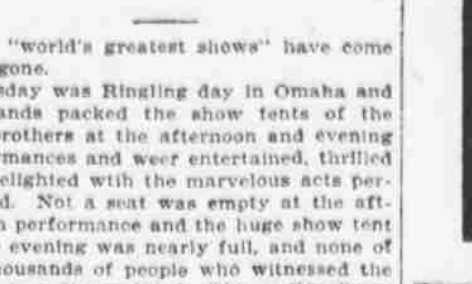
SUIT TO RECOVER COAL LAND
