Hint for Cutting Buttonholes

To cut buttonholes through two or three thicknesses of material without separating the fabric, mark the place and size of buttonhole with basting thread or chalk and with a fine stitch and thread to match the buttonhole twist each stitch with machine each side of and quite close to this mark. Cut the buttonhole between the lines of stitching. This will not only hold the various thicknesses together, but will form a stay over which the buttonhole may be worked. All buttonholes should be dampened and pressed.
