AFFAIRS AT SOUTH OMAHA

Top Price for Hogs Was Realized on Saturday. CHOICE LOAD BROUGHT \$7.40

Shortage in Receipts of Hogs Main Cause of High Price and Cattle and Lambs Also Go Up. The extreme top price for hogs this year was paid Saturday, when a choice load of sixty hogs brought \$7.40 per hundred. The prices have been mending for a week or more and the bulk of the sales have been close around \$7.20. One reason for the great increase in price has been light receipts. After a good run for the season until May 1, the receipts dropped off, as compared with last year, until a difference of nearly \$3.00 has arisen since May 1. The actual difference has been 20.83 cents representing the decrease in price, but about the first of the month the receipts, which had been gradually gaining, began to rise again. One reason for the decrease has been that the late spring has at last brought all the acreage planted with a great variety of crops and the farmers, in spite of the tempting prices, have had no time to market their hogs. Only 40,000 hogs were received in South Omaha during the week. Cattle have gained 20 to 25 cents during the week and lambs show an increase over last year of about 10.00. The prices paid for lambs have been very high during the week. As high as \$2.35 for the tops has been paid. Receipts have been light in all respects.

Live Stock Exchange and Banks. In view of the investigations of the comptroller of the currency respecting the application of the several banks of South Omaha to be placed on the list of reserve cities, and what has been conceived as an opposition to that application on the part of the banks of Omaha, the South Omaha Live Stock exchange, at a special meeting held May 13, unanimously decided to throw the weight of its influence on the side of the South Omaha banks.

The investigations of the comptroller have been in progress for some weeks and have recently been continued upon. The object of the designation of South Omaha as a reserve city is that the surplus reserve of numerous country banks may be deposited in the large banks of South Omaha as provided by the national banking laws. In order to facilitate the investigations and to leave the way clear for the exchange adopted resolutions directed to the Omaha banks that they might see fit to withdraw the objections at Washington.

It is variously estimated that if the wishes of the South Omaha bankers are granted in accord with the application as much as \$50,000 in deposits may be very soon transferred to South Omaha. It is threatened by the South Omaha banks that they will withdraw from the clearing house if the Omaha banks persist in opposing.

Baker Brothers Lost Game. A good crowd of rooters were out yesterday afternoon to support the South Omaha Country club team, which defeated the Baker Brothers team of Omaha, at the South Omaha club grounds. The game was a close one, but the Baker boys were heavy. Both teams did good work and the score was 4 to 3, in favor of the South Omaha Country club and Quigley and Brugeman for the Baker Brothers team were the star performers. Three two base hits were recorded. Quigley was named to Baker brother from the South Omaha Country club team.

Several matches in golf were enjoyed during the afternoon. Honors of the day were won by J. J. Fitzgerald. Richard Lavery played close second during the first 18 holes, but in the second game of the afternoon had a streak of bad luck. Many games will be played this afternoon.

Went Street Car Extension. A special meeting of the West Side Improvement club is called at Rex hall at 2 p. m. today. The object of the meeting is to discuss plans for an extension of the street car services south from Thirty-second and B streets, which is the present termination of the west side Hanscom park line. The club has grown tired of asking for a viaduct over L street and a car service on that side, and they now ask that the west side park car be extended to the South Omaha yards. Such a course will have bitter opposition.

Touched While Asleep. Paul Hackenholz, who lives at 2627 Jefferson, reported to the police yesterday that he had been robbed while sitting asleep in a chair in one of the South Omaha saloons Friday night. He said he lost his watch and \$11. He had no knowledge of anyone being near him while he was asleep. The police investigated the case, but have found little as yet on which to base a clue. The saloonkeeper where the alleged crime is said to have been committed disclaimed any knowledge of it and said he had noticed Hackenholz asleep in the chair for some time, but had seen no one near him.

Paving Stakes Set on E. The South Omaha engineering department set stakes on E street for the paving of that street west of Twenty-fourth yesterday. The time limit of the contract is fixed for June 15. Hugh Murphy has the contract and is ready to proceed with the work. It will in all probability be finished by the time the limit expires. The bonds for the payment of this paving have been sold at a small premium. But the money has not yet been received. The other paving operations have not begun. High Murphy holds none of the other contracts.

Militant. South Omaha's newest and largest addition was placed on sale Saturday morning, May 15. A great many people visited the place for the first time. The parcel, all bought a lot. The sale will continue all day today or until all bids have been returned.
