WESTERN FLOODS. St. Louis, May 16.—Opposite Jefferson Barracks a number of houses were undermined by the flood and wrecked. It is believed that all the occupants escaped. On Mullaphy Island, 25 miles north of St. Louis, in the Missouri, fourteen women and children were rescued by a volunteer corps. Several dead bodies have been seen floating in the water. Most of them evidently came from a distance. It is now a common sight to see small houses and various articles of furniture travelling past. All railroad traffic over the Eads bridge has been abandoned, owing to the flooded tracks in Illinois. The Burlington, Alton and other roads run passenger trains in over the Merchant's Bridge. The Walker soap works, Laffin powder depot, Meyer & Hanson's fertilizer company's establishments, and several dairies and warehouses are all flooded and work stopped. About two hundred more houses have been wrecked.

The most serious aspect is found near Venice. Between there and Jolpin is a small dike; the water backing up on the Brooklyn side a flooding several fine farms, and the owners of these went down yesterday morning to cut the dike, as by doing this the water would run through on the Venice side, where the land is lower. The Venetians, however, are satisfied with the amount of water they possess, and about twenty of them, armed with shot guns, patrolled the dike to prevent any attempt to cut it. The Brooklyn men are said as determined to drain their side. Up to midnight, no serious trouble was reported, but both sides were on alert, and a conflict may ensue.

Gordon, President of the United Confederate Veterans, has appointed a committee of nineteen, one from each of the Southern States, to present a memorial and petition before the legislature of each State asking them to vote a life pension to the widow of Jefferson Davis.

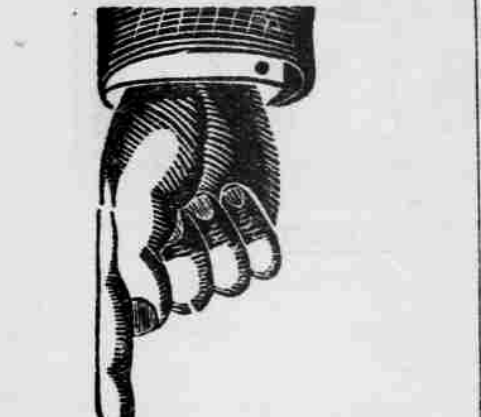
