## GRAND ARMY RANKS GROWING THINNER

Indianapolis, Ind., Sept. 6.—Fifty- six years ago a small group of young men, veterans of the Civil war, were banded together by Dr. Benjamin F. Stephenson of Decatur, Ill. After or- ganizing, the name bestowed upon the body was the Grand Army of the Republic.

Organization began April 6, 1865 and the first National encampment was held in Indianapolis beginning Nov. 20 of the same year. There are no authentic records to give the at- tendance at that meeting, out of which grew one of the most powerful and influential bodies ever welded to- gether in the United States. It must have been small, however, for one of the first theatres in Indianapolis was used for the meeting place, and it held only a few hundred persons.

Membership campaigns by the Grand Army of the Republic con- tinued from year to year, but an of- ficial record of the membership is available only so far back as 1878, when it was given as 31,016. It was about this time that the men who had fought and won a great war be- gan to make their presence felt in all matters pertaining to the advance- ment of the country and as a result the G. A. R. increased in member- ship strength by many thousands.

The crest of the strength of the organization was reached in 1889 and 1890, when 409,489 were reported in good standing. The peak was reach- ed at that time as figures given at the encampment the following year showed a loss of approximately two thousand.

Death has caused a great furrow in the ranks of the old soldiers year- ly since that time, until at present there are fewer than 93,000 of the "boys in blue" left. What few re- main, however, are planning, ac- cording to national officers, to have a goodly representation present at the fifty-sixth national encampment to be held at Des Moines, Sept. 24 to 29.

## WORLD DELEGATES TO DRY CONFERENCE

Toronto, Canada, Sept. 7.—Forty countries are expected to be represented at the international student conference of the international prohibition association to be held here November 24 to 29.

Among the delegates more than 500 from colleges in the United States and Canada have announced they will attend. The conference will be held in cooperation with the convention of the world league against alcoholism. Among the speakers who will address the conference are Dr. R. Herold of Switzerland, director of the international temperance bureau, the Right Honorable Lief Jones of England, president of the United Kingdom alliance, Jnananjan Nyogi of India, secretary of the Bengal social service league, C. C. Weeks of London, president of the world student federation against alcoholism and Dr. Ira Landrith, president of the intercollegiate prohibition association.
