

PEKING-SHANGHAI AIR MAIL SERVICE LIKELY

Shanghai, April 6.—(Delayed)—The Peking-Shanghai air mail service in all likelihood will be an established reality summer is well advanced. Contracts for the building of two aero hangars at the Shanghai terminal were let following the purchase of the land. Incidentally these contracts were let to an American company.
It was planned to start work on these hangars in April and they are to be completed within four months. The similar hangars are being built at Peking and negotiations for the location of hangars at Tsingtao, Shan and Pucheng, Pulow are being carried toward.
At each of the four aerodromes two heavy commercial airplanes will be stationed and the actual flying will be done by relay when the seasons permit. Ultimately it is the purpose of the Chinese government to extend its air service and to establish passenger-carrying services.

TAKES CATAWBA EXAMPLE FOR PROGRESS

Diversified farming is a live subject in most North Carolina towns and cities these days and Catawba county is being pointed to as an example of what several good crops will do for a community. Cooperation is another live subject. Record readers will be interested in the following editorial from the Kinston Free Press:
Cooperative marketing has become a live topic in Kinston and it is one that can well engage the best thought of this section. For several years the Free Press has urged the wisdom of the establishment of local markets, which would enable the farmers to dispose easily of every crop that they can do profitably raise. Recently as has been referred to before, the chamber of commerce, at the suggestion of its president, J. J. Mewborne, has been advocating and planning for cooperative markets.
There are numerous examples throughout the country where diversified industry and cooperative markets have been important factors in development. The state of Georgia has several illustrations; among them is Quitman, a town of some five thousand people. The Free Press understands that several years ago, its market on home raised and cured meats had been developed to a point where it was not unusual for 30,000 pounds of meat to be sold on its exchange in a single day.
But it's not necessary to go to Georgia for such illustrations. North Carolina has some splendid examples of her own. Elsewhere in this issue the Free Press is reprinting an article as written by Col. Fred A. Olds and is a most interesting story of the success of Catawba county, which Col. Olds describes as the most "highly developed and cooperated county in all North Carolina." Hickory, has about fifty different industries. One of them as will be noted by reading Col. Olds' article is the Catawba Creamery, which does an annual business of close to a million dollars and handles cream, butter, eggs, cheese and poultry, all home raised. The creamery is owned by more than 400 stockholders, most of whom are farmers. The story is an inspiring one and the Free Press commends it to every reader of the paper.
Further evidence of the success of the cooperative idea in Hickory is

attested by a news item, appearing in Saturday's News and Observer. The article reads as follows: "City tax-listers say that despite the depression for the past several months, Hickory people are giving in more money than ever before. This indicates the condition of prosperity, they say, and it is generally admitted that there is plenty of money in this section, thanks to the diversification of farming.
Diversification of farming and cooperative marketing is no wild theory. It's practical solution of the problem that confronts the farmer who depends upon the one or two so-called money crops and who because of that fact, must over and over again experience lean and disastrous years.
