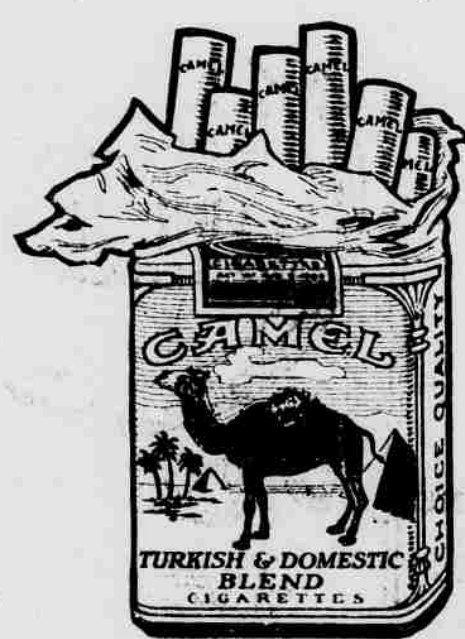
**CAPTAIN BOWMAN RETURNS**
