WAS BUSINESS MEANT IN FLY- PROOF ORDINANCES OF CITY?

(Jackson County Journal.)

Hendersonville proposes to have a clean bill of health this summer. To that end the board of city commissioners have passed ordinances which if conscientiously enforced will tend to make Hendersonville a clean and healthful town in fact as well as in name. For instance, an ordinance was passed recently making it unlawful, with a penalty of fifty dollars for each day of the violation, for any person to maintain either a privy or water closet that is not absolutely fly-proof. All privies accessible to sewers are to be abolished and sewer connections made. Another ordinance requires that all stables shall have dry fly-proof bins with maggot-proof bottoms for the daily smorgage of all manure and that once a week all manure shall be removed from the city.

A further requirement was that all market places be kept clean, sanitary, screened from flies and open to the inspection of the city health officers at any time, and that all meats be kept covered and fly-proof while in transportation.

The commissioners went a step further and made it unlawful for any person or firm to engage in washing and ironing without first having procured a certificate of good health from the city health officer, steam laundries excepted.

To the city health officer, Dr. J. Frank Cranford, is the credit of these ordinances, which, if strictly enforced will go a long way toward making this city what it should be as a summer resort—safe for visitors. It remains for Hendersonville to really show whether she meant business when these ordinances were passed or not.

NO EXTRA CONGRESS WANTED.

Washington, July 15.—United States Senator Simmons and Representative Godwin who are here on departmental business told officials of the administration that North Carolinians, irrespective of political affiliations, have great faith in the ability of President Wilson to handle the delicate foreign situation and approve of his policy so far.

Neither Senator Simmons nor Representative Godwin believe that it will be necessary to call Congress in extra session before December 1. They are not among those senators and congressmen who are urging the president to have Congress meet before the regular term to take action to prevent the shipment from this country of arms and ammunition to the warring nations.
