Tuesday, May 23—Miss Janie Laster, Nursing; Leslie Towe, Accounting & Bookkeeping; Frank Williams, Textile.

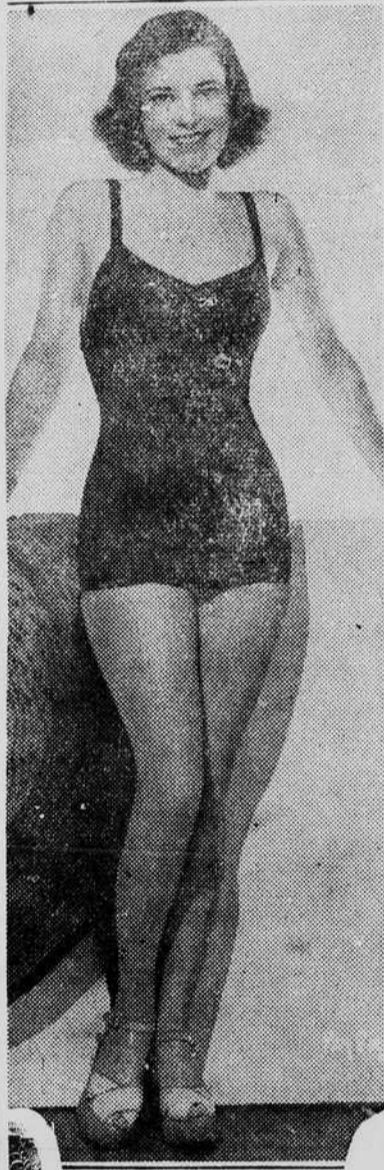
Thursday, May 25—J. T. Chase, Engineering; Curtis Shell, Salesmanship; Dr. John W. Martin, Medicine.
