### COX DOES NOT DRINK

He Has Always Favored Votes for Women.

Mrs. Daniel J. Mahoney, the chubby, pink and white young daughter of Governor Cox of Ohio, the Democratic candidate for President, had a few terse remarks to make about the convention last night in her apartment at the Fairmont hotel, says a San Francisco dispatch.

"That women were narrow, most of them," said Mrs. Mahoney, and she added that she thought their "sort of cooked their goose at this convention."

"But don't you print that," said the chubby girl with the blue crocheted hat of angora wool and a sport suit of tan, above which she looked carelessly radiant. "Why that Antonette Funk said the other day, after administering a neat snub to me, 'Mr. McAdoo can tell me more in a minute than your father could in a lifetime.'"

"My father, as a matter of fact, has always been for woman's suffrage. The women here don't know him, but he is going to start his campaign in the west, so they will know him. If my father ever took a drink I don't know it, but I think the women have acted decidedly narrow in the matter, most of them. Father never has been anything but abstemious and he is not for whiskey, only for beer."

"He thinks," said Mrs. Mahoney, "that the working man ought to have his mug of beer. That's the way he feels about it. He isn't interested in wine for the rich. In fact, when he makes a statement you will see that he won't talk advocating wine at all, only beer for the laborer. Why shouldn't he have it?"

When asked if it were true if Mrs. Mahoney is related, on her mother's side, the mother being the first Mrs. Cox, to Mr. Harding, the Republican nominee, Mr. Mahoney hurried to explain.

"No, that's another Harding family. If there is any relationship it is so distant that there isn't any use tracing it. The Harding family that the first Mrs. Cox was related to, lived in Kentucky, but it is not the family of the Republican nominee. A statement to that effect would have to be denied later because it is another family."
