## Mrs. Nation Takes a Turn in Charlotte.

Mrs. Carrie Nation exhorted twice and sold little hatchets several times in Charlotte yesterday. She is a stirring speaker and as a natural consequence, a saleswoman of no mean ability. Her denunciations, gestulations and enthusiasm at the court house yesterday afternoon and last night were sizzling in comparison with the weather, which was strictly summer.  
 An enormous crowd heard her at night. People came even from the country to get a glimpse of the woman who flashed like a streak of lightning at Wichita, Kan., seven years ago. The folks elbowed themselves into standing room in the study court house to see her march in with her little hatchet filled with hatchets and Carrie Nation literature, and then, after giving her hearty cheer, some of them mopped their foreheads and twisted themselves out to let newcomers have standing room.  
 "Well, I saw what sort of looking woman she is, anyhow," they would say before going to the moving picture shows or to the park.  
 And during all this time, Mrs. Nation was exhorted. She was telling the people about Carrie Nation. "Nearly everybody has heard something about Carrie Nation," she said, "but nobody has ever heard the truth about Carrie Nation. They have said that I am ridiculous, that I am a fanatic, and that I am crazy, but I want to tell you that I am doing that work in the world that God mapped out for me when I was consecrated—the work that nobody else can do."  
 "Yes, they have made all manner of fun of me, but today the policy of Carrie Nation is the policy that the world needs. 'Every nation welcome but Carrie Nation' is a sign that they place in Western saloons. Why do they do this? It is because they are ahead of every nation but Carrie Nation."  
 Mrs. Nation covers a wide field and forgets neither the high nor the low in her discourses. She makes prohibition the central point, but she diverges into all directions and rallies all classes and conditions of men under the main theme. Republicans are as bad as Democrats and President Roosevelt is no worse than Col. Bryan, but the man who believes in temperance is the man after her heart. And she likes the poor man, too.  
 "I was reading today something in one of your papers about the Governor of your State," she said, "and I want to tell you that he is the right sort of a man. He talks prohibition and he believes in prohibition. When he steps down from his present office I want you to give him something better; I want you to send him to the United States Senate."  
 Mrs. Nation deals in a most interesting manner in reminiscences. People remember her principally for her hatchet-slinging proclivities and they like to hear her paint in words some of her experiences. "When they played me in jail once," she remembered, "the cruel man who slammed the iron door in my face saw tears in my eyes and he shouted to his associates, 'She is humbled now because she is crying.' But I shouted back to them that I would never give up my fight and when they let me out I would make hell howl. Then it went all over the country that Carrie Nation had cursed. They did this to make a wrong impression on the world as to my motives in life."  
 Many people who went to the court house last night through curiosity remained through the sermon. If the impression in Charlotte was general before yesterday that Mrs. Nation is, course, unrefined and a joke, that impression does not prevail with many today. She talks fluently, uses good English and thinks clearly. She is an agreeable surprise.  
 After the discourse Mrs. Nation sold a large number of her little hatchets. She returned to Salisbury early this morning.

## Interesting Items of News.

Dr. James Dinwiddie, for sixteen years president of Peace Institute, Raleigh, died at the home of his son in California last Tuesday.

It is announced that the biggest attraction of the State fair in Raleigh in October will be William J. Bryan and William Cody, better known as Buffalo Bill.

Four men near Newbern sought shelter in a house from a thunder storm Tuesday and lightning struck and wrecked the house and killed one of them. There seems to be an unusual number of deaths from lightning throughout the State this year.

Five hundred soldiers, members of the second South Carolina and first Kentucky regiments in camp at the Jamestown exposition grounds, Thursday night became riotous, threw off all discipline, ran over concessionaries, taking charge of the board of education that had been removed. A riot followed, several being injured.

Will Fesperman, a trapeze performer, was seriously injured at Salisbury by falling from a pole forty feet to the ground. At a public exhibition he attempted to stand on his head on the pole and lost his balance and fell like a dart, landing on his head. The accident was witnessed by a thousand or more people. Fesperman is a Rowan county man.

Mr. J. W. Bailey, chairman of the executive committee of the Anti Saloon League, reports that a live campaign has been started in Elenton to rid that town of its ten bar rooms. Mr. Bailey spoke at an anti saloon rally there a few days ago, when there was 800 or 1,000 people present. He predicts that the good old town of Elenton will at a day not far distant be freed from its ten saloons.

All Eastern Carolina is wrought up over the location of the training school voted by the legislature. The board of education has made the rounds of every town that has bid for the school, and it was announced that the decision would be given out last Thursday, but the board did not decide and put off the agony until the 10th of the month. Meanwhile all those places that want the school and have offered land and money for it, are in suspense that produces pain.

Governor Hughes of New York and Woodrow Wilson, president of Princeton University, were the orators of the day at the joint Independence Day celebration and first annual reunion of the lineal descendants of the signers of the Declaration of Independence at the Jamestown exposition July 4th.

The reunion was held under the auspices of the Thomas Jefferson Memorial Association, of which former Secretary of the Navy Hilary A. Herbert is the acting president.

On account of their unproper relations, Raeford Deen, a negro of good standing near Wilson, shot his wife to death, then went to his brother's house and killed him. The slayer then went to Mr. Lamm's store and got twelve dollars Mr. Lamm owed him. Then he went home, packed his grip, kissed his children and told them goodbye, saying they would never see him again. He changed his mind, however, and surrendered to Deputy Mumford.

The Fourth in Wadesboro. A party of congenial spirits, all of whom, with one exception, were traveling men, were talking together in the lobby of the Buford yesterday afternoon. The "Fourth" was being discussed and many were the stories told. One of the number had spent Independence Day in Hickory, another in Greensboro, a third in Lincolnton, a fourth in Salisbury with Aunt Carrie and the rest at different points.

"My Fourth was spent in Wadesboro, the capital of Anson," remarked one of the number, "and for the size of the town and the number of people, was the most hilarious and all round glorious Fourth I ever experienced.

"Such shooting and yelling I never before heard and hope I never will again. The little city, a beautiful place, was filled with negroes from early morning until late at night. They commenced coming in at daybreak and started to drink as soon as they arrived. The procession to the jail began early in the day and continued until I dropped off asleep late in the evening. The guard house, a comparatively new building, was soon filled and the county jail was pressed into service. That, too, was crowded before dark. The local police officers were busily engaged in marching drunk darkies to the city lock-up all day. It was an exciting procession. As fast as one was disposed of here came another. So great grew the number of prisoners that the officers were forced to carry the overflow down to the depot and there lock them up in box cars. After midnight, there were drunk negroes lying around in almost every back lot. Exhausted with the heat of the day and sleepy from the effect of the liquor they had imbibed, a number dropped off before they could reach their wagons and leave town. I venture the assertion that no city in the State celebrated the Fourth as did Wadesboro. As for darkies, never before have I seen so many. They were present in great crowds. They took absolute possession of the principal walks and in many places filled the streets. About the doors, front and back, of the eight or nine saloons, they were gathered like bees about a hive. A few white people moved about here and there but not many. The negroes had it all their own way. Three big box cars were required to hold the overflow."
