WHEAT SCORES SLIGHT GAINS

Undergoes Slight General Setback at Opening, Then Rises All Around

Chicago, Dec. 15.—(AP)—Speculative buying lifted wheat today, despite a downward trend at the start, the buying was ascribed to smallness of Chicago wheat stocks and to falling off in the domestic crop movement. Extreme low temperatures counted also as accumulating factor.

Wheat closed firm, 1 1/2 to 1 3/4 cents net higher. Corn 1/2 to 3/4 cents up, also showing 1/2 to 1 1/4 cents advance and provisions at gains of five cents to 70 cents.

Considerable notice was taken today of smallness of wheat primary receipts, especially of the fact that 725,682 bushels, the stock largely 4,500,000; number loads heifers upward to 7.75; cutters 3,500,000; bulls strong, mostly 5,000,000; good heaves 6.25 and above; stockers and feeders light supply, about steady; 5,250,000; calves 1,000; vealers unevenly 5.50; more higher; bulk good lights 10.50; choice upward to 11.00 and above.

Hogs, 12,000; market opening strong to 15 cents higher; some sales butchers and lights 11.15; best held higher; packing sows 10.00 to 10.25; bidding around 25 lower on pigs, or over-sold technical condition was a large factor in the upturn.

Oats futures were firm advancing 1/2 to 3/4 cent profit taking called out a halt. May rye was 1/2 cent higher at best up to midday. May barley eased early and turned firm with other grains. May flaxseed started easy with midday tables 1/2 cent lower, but support improved locally and the market moved up one cent.

Cash wheat offerings were small, especially of desirable milling quality. Demand was quiet to fair and trading basis was steady.

Corn receipts were light and demand for low grade yellow as better, with trading basis one to two cents higher.

Oats were in fair to good demand. Rye was slow for ordinary quality. Barley was firm.

Flaxseed offerings were scanty and demand was quiet.
