Bill Birch had not returned from the Big Salmon, where he had gone to stake out claims in the rush of two months ago. Mr. Trenholme will remain at this place for three weeks when he will return to Alaska taking with him the cattle purchased for that purpose by Jas. McCabe during the spring.

In the United States court at Fargo last Thursday Judge Amidon directed the jury in the case of United States vs. J. G. Dawes to bring in a verdict for the defendant. This will be remembered as the case last fall in which Mr. Dawes was charged with buying Canadian wheat at Hannah. The evidence shows that defendant applied for a license for abandoned warehouse—papers were approved and everything all right—daily expecting the permit. Mr. Dawes bought some Canadian wheat, put it in a separate bin and notified the authorities and was told "that's all right," sealed up the bin, "but don't do so any more." This was in November. Dawes then went over into Manitoba and bought wheat there, preparatory to shipping it in when his license came. Then a United States government agent swooped down upon him with all the power of the treasury department. He was arrested in Manitoba and came over to this side voluntarily. A big newspaper trial went on—the agent was a wonderful man—and Dawes had to bear the brunt of having once worked for the Great Northern—which alone was suspicious. Mr. Dawes appeared on Monday morning promptly, was arraigned. The evidence was about the same as given above. Returning with the officer by his own consent established the facts given, the evidence for the government closed. Attorney Lee moved that the court direct the jury to return a verdict for the defendant which was promptly done and Mr. Dawes is today a free man on the evidence solely adduced by witnesses put on the stand by the prosecution.
