TEMPERANCE NOTES

(Conducted by the National Woman's Christian Temperance Union.)

HINT FOR SALOONKEEPERS.

"You see that building," said a saloonkeeper in Montana. "That is all I have in the world. I worked hard to build and equip it. There I earn the food and clothing for my wife and babies. You women say you are going to put me out of business. That will ruin my property. How am I to support my family?" I thought of the many families that his business was making hungry and unhappy, but I said nothing of this, for there was to me a pathos in his plea and to him it was a very real problem. In the seven states that recently went dry there are thousands that meet the same conditions. They are cast adrift upon a wholly uncharted sea and they see nothing beyond.

I answered: "My friend, when Montana goes dry, and as sure as you and I live Montana is going dry, that lot will remain just where it is. Unless there is a fire, and against that you can continue to protect your property by insurance as you are doing now, your building will remain where it is. Just lower your bar and make a counter of it. Put in some more windows, at a slight expense, and sell tea, coffee, sugar, flour, shoes—any commodity—to the very same people who patronize you now and receive in exchange the same kind of dollars. Perhaps, my friend, you have not thought that Mr. Brown over there who now comes to your place nightly and spends his money, may come in and buy a pair of shoes for his little Mary, who sadly needs them. This purchase on his part will not unfit him to earn another day's wage tomorrow to buy something needed for his small son, Jimmie. And then perhaps he will come in the next night and buy a sack of flour, taking it home to his wife to use in making bread. As for Mr. Brown himself, he will go to bed and get a good night's sleep and the next day he will be able to earn enough more funds to buy a sack of potatoes. Do you not see that you may sell from the same building to the same people who now patronize you and get even more money? I am sure, too, that your wife will be happier and your children will no longer be shunned. We are not fighting you, my friend, but we are fighting your kind of business. Why not try to get into something honorable before the storm comes and be ready for the new trade?"

He answered earnestly: "Perhaps I'd better. Anyhow, I'll consider it. I see you women are not just abusing us. You are not the kind I thought you were."—Adah Wallace Unruh, National W. C. T. U. Organizer.

NEW TEMPERANCE GOSPEL.

"Temperance work today is very practical as compared with the sentimental exhortations of yesterday," pertinently remarks an exchange. "In these days, when 'efficiency' is so general a watchword in the world of business and labor, we are finding not so directly that a man is a knave who drinks to excess, or even as all, as that he is a fool. A runner who ties a weight about his leg is no greater dunce than the workman or the merchant who puts a dram of liquor into his digestion or his brain. It is capable of proof by figures and diagrams that the drinker of even an occasional glass of wine or beer or whisky injures the work of both his hands and his mind, while the habitual drinker sews up his mental and manual machinery permanently. This is the gospel of the new temperance movement."

NO BACKWARD STEPS.

Judge Tully Scott of Colorado's supreme court, speaking to the toast "Democracy's Opportunity" at a Democratic banquet, made this statement: "In my opinion constitutional prohibition will never be repealed in Colorado. I believe it to be as firmly established as the provision for equal suffrage, and I believe we all agree that any effort to repeal the grant of equal suffrage in this state would prove as futile as an attempt to repeal the natural law of gravitation."

COWARDLY PLEA.

HAD FAITH IN HIM

Lesson to Be Drawn From the Actions of Jairus and the Sick Woman.

"My daughter is even now dead; but come and lay thy hand upon her, and she shall live. . . . The woman said within herself, If I do but touch his garment I shall be made whole."—Matt. 9:18-21.

Two remarkable stories in one and the same paragraph, two wonderful restorations, two supreme instances of the power of true faith.

Let us revert for a moment to the scene. The dignified form of a ruler of the synagogue as he appears upon the threshold of an apartment in which publicans and sinners are feasting, is no whit stranger to the baffled banqueters than the presence of Christ in such an environment appeared to be to the carping critics drawn from the ranks of the Pharisees and Scribes standing without.

Our heart goes out to Jairus because he has left the bedside of a dying daughter. The symptoms, the verdict of the physicians, the innate consciousness impress upon him, as he stands in the presence of Christ, the conviction, "My daughter is even now dead," even now while I am speaking there is no hope unless Christ be superhuman, unless he be divine. Yet there is a hope; for he is assured that though she be even now dead she may be, she will be, reclaimed. "Come and lay thy hand upon her and she shall live."

This is his prayer. Leaving the happy circle of those whom he blessed with his presence, Jesus and the ruler lead the way homeward. Their progress is intercepted by a woman whose chronic illness has prompted her in faith to touch the garment of Jesus, who, realizing the outflow of power, turning, demands to know who it was that touched him.

Her Abundant Faith.

Trembling with fear, realizing that she has been the cause of this commotion and delay, knowing that she has been discovered, the sick woman, a patient no longer, steps forth and acknowledges before all the people that it was she who touched his garments in response to the conviction that if only she do so she could be made whole. . . . While Jesus is still speaking a messenger from the home of Jairus conveys the tidings surmised by the ruler and known by Jesus: "Thy daughter is dead, trouble not the Teacher." The compassion of the Savior is thoroughly aroused. Turning to the ruler, he exclaims in words which cannot be misunderstood, "Fear not, only believe, and she shall be made whole." The ruler trusts his physician, guide and comforter. Jesus assumes the initiative and leads him to the house which is already being turned over to professional Oriental lamentation. The word of power and life penetrates farther than the discordant sounds of empty rites. "Talitha Kumi" (maiden arise). No empty form; not even a sacred commitment of the body to the earth; but a recall of the spirit. The narrative concludes simply: "Her spirit returned and she rose up immediately."

"To what extent can, ought and will Christianity help me?" is but a restatement of the words used by two needy individuals reflecting upon their condition. Put the question in any other form you please: "Have I a right to expect anything from Christianity? Will it influence, mellow and transform my life? Is it worth while? Is it a good thing not only to die by but to live by as well? What must be my relationship toward it and its relationship toward me? Is it to be compared with the medicine in a vial in the medicine chest, which is to be used every day, or at regular intervals, or perhaps only occasionally as a tonic? Or ought it to be compared with the air we breathe and without which we cannot exist?"

True Spiritual Life.

In coming to Christianity we have the right to demand and there rests upon us an obligation to demand life—physical, moral, spiritual life. This is to be the measure of the request. To what extent can, ought and will Christianity help me? It will lend unto me a spiritual life which will renew me through and through. The raising of Jairus' daughter from the dead, the healing of the invalid woman, were not ends in themselves; they were means to a higher end. We all believe, we know without doubt, that the ruler and the woman obtained something more than physical and moral benefits. Spiritual life has been imparted to them. "Thy faith hath made thee whole," may be predicted of the ruler as surely as it is told the woman.

To what extent can, ought and will Christianity help me? To the extent of the measure of my faith, to the extent of my recognition of a force other than my own, prompting, urging, inviting, healing.

Thou art coming to a King; Large petitions with thee bring; For his grace and power are such, None can ever ask too much.

Building Christian Character.

It is a fact that all Christian parents would like to see their children grow up in piety; and the better Christians they are, the more earnestly they desire it; and the more lovely and constant the Christian spirit they manifest, the more likely it is, in general, that their children will early display the Christian character.—Bushnell

CANADA'S PLANS FOR WAR REVENUE

So Wisely Distributed That Taxation Will Affect Farmers to a Degree Practically Unnoticeable.

So many rumors have been circulated regarding war taxation in Canada that the statement made by Sir Thomas White, Canadian Minister of Finance, of the Government's plans for raising war revenue should be given the widest circulation. Sir Thomas made it clear that the revenue will be raised by taxing the profits of incorporated companies whenever those profits exceed seven per cent, and the profits of unincorporated firms or partnerships when the profits exceed ten per cent. On all such excess profits these companies or firms will have to contribute one-quarter to the Government. Transportation companies, banks, mining, milling, and other companies will be subject to this taxation, but life insurance companies, and companies with less than fifty thousand dollars capitalization, and companies, firms, or individuals engaged in agriculture or stock raising, are exempt, and pay no part of this taxation. The only other additional taxation proposed is an increase of fifty cents a barrel in the customs duty on apples, and one-half cent a gallon in customs duty on certain kinds of oils.

It will be noticed that this taxation is being applied in such a way that it does not affect farmers in the slightest degree, except, perhaps, through a small increase in cost of apples and oil. The war revenue is to be paid out of the profits of the big firms and companies with capital of over fifty thousand dollars, and even these are allowed seven per cent in some cases, and ten per cent in others, of clear profits before they have to pay any part of this taxation. It will be seen that the whole policy is to place the war expenditure taxation on those who have been making big profits and are able to pay it, and to encourage farming and stockraising by exempting farmers and stockraisers from the taxation. This ought to set at rest every rumor that the farmer or the farmer's land is being taxed to pay the cost of the war.—Advertisement.
