match, but referee Jones made the announcement that when Sharkey reached his dressing room he felt severe pains in his shoulders. Dr. Brace, who was present, was called and after a careful examination advised the Irish wrestler not to go on again as he had sprained a number of the tendons in his right shoulder. The referee then announced as Mr. Hansen was ready to go on and Sharkey was not, the match belonged to the Danish champion.

In the preliminaries John Dwyer, of North Amboy, had a go with "Steve" Decker, also of North Amboy, in the catch-as-catch-can style, the best two out of three falls for a purse of \$5, pin falls to count with strangle hold barred. In the first bout Dwyer won, being able to get Decker to the mat in just twenty minutes with a body hold. In the second bout Dwyer again came in ahead this time, downing Decker with the arm lock hold in two minutes and forty seconds.

At the end of the first bout of the Hansen-Sharkey match referee Jones introduced to the audience Frank Parcal, of Brooklyn, the heavyweight champion of Prussia, who had asked to be allowed to speak for a minute. He said:

"A short time ago H. P. Hansen issued a challenge through the papers and also the Police Gazette, of New York, to the effect that he was open to all comers. Now, although I am ready to meet Hansen in any style for \$300, or half the gate receipts, I have received no answer to my challenge." Mr. Parcal took his seat amid the cheers of the crowd.

After the wrestling match was over J. D. Donohue, the manager of H. P. Hansen, told a News reporter that he had accepted the offer made by Frank Parcal and the match will doubtless take place in a week or two. The style is to be Graeco-Roman.

At the present time Parcal weighs 180 pounds.
