The delegates to the Territorial republican convention, which meets in this city to-morrow, have begun to arrive. The Optic speaks for the people of Las Vegas, in according to them a warm welcome to our city, and assures them that differences of political faith do not enter into the personal feelings of the citizens of Las Vegas toward her guests.

CONVENTION NOTES. All the counties in the Territory are represented, with the exception of San Juan, Chaves and Eddy. Gen. E. L. Bartlett, the efficient chairman of the republican central committee, reached the city, this afternoon. Malaguia Martinez will represent the county of Taos, to-morrow. He has four proxies, in addition to his own vote. Ex-Gov. L. Bradford Prince is here, representing the county of Rio Arriba, with six proxies in his pocket, in addition to his own vote. Nathan Jaffa, delegate from Chaves county, telegraphs from El Paso, Texas, that he missed rail connection and hence cannot reach Las Vegas in time. Don Pedro Peres, a republican wheelhorse of Bernalillo county, and a delegate to the convention, is on the ground, and laboring with the delegations in certain interests. Capt. S. M. Saltmarsh, T. A. Fincal and W. H. H. Allison are up from Albuquerque, the latter a former resident of Las Vegas, engaged in the sewing machine business. Gov. E. S. Stover, the prominent Albuquerquean and leading republican is elbowing around among the crowd, good-humoredly, but with no congressional bee buzzing in his bonnet. It is generally understood that Delegate T. B. Catron will be the nominee, to-morrow, Sunday, or Monday, though Don Pedro Peres, of Bernalillo county, can have the nomination, if he wants it. Col. Geo. W. Frichard, who has the support of Lincoln county for the nomination for the delegateship, is an early arrival, accompanied by M. S. Tallaferro, chairman of the republican central committee and a leading merchant, down there. Hon. Thos. Hughes, editor and proprietor of the Albuquerque Citizen, a delegate from Bernalillo county, is up and around among the boys and is a whole convention within himself. He's for the nominee of to-morrow's convention, horse, foot and dragon. Col. Max Frost, secretary of the Territorial central committee and a delegate from Santa Fe county, is in our city today. He seems to know what is going on and is evidently very popular with the delegates. He has the knack of keeping them in good humor, anyhow.

Accidentally Killed. Walter Hamilton accidentally shot himself, Wednesday afternoon, near Cimarron, Colfax county. He, in company with Wm. Jones and Jas. Letton, of Raton, was starting out prospecting. When near the Springer ranch, east of Cimarron, his revolver dropped out of the belt, the hammer struck an iron rod in falling and discharged the gun. The ball ranged through his body, causing his death in about an hour. He leaves a family in Kentucky. Deceased was about thirty-six years old. His body was taken to Raton by J. H. Jenkins. A coroner's inquest was held, this morning, when a verdict of accidental death was rendered. The remains were taken in charge of by Undertakers Nott and Givens and embalmed and were sent to his former home at McHenry, Kentucky, where he is survived by a wife and two children.

TRACK AND TRAIN. Fireman Wheat is on the off list. Some new ties are being put in the main line below the depot. The painting outfit made its first trip on the road, to-day, going up to Shoemaker. Caboose No. 559 and 800 were taken to Raton, yesterday, where they will be overhauled. Engine No. 488 was on the springs branch, this morning, the regular engine being in the shops. Engineer Wm. Baynton has an extended leave of absence, and left last evening for Kansas City, where he will visit friends and relatives. The tie-picking works at this place will cease to operate after to-morrow. The last load of ties was put in this morning. The works will probably be idle for three or four months.
