DELEGATES OF TO-DAY

Nebraska Republicans Swung for McKinley by Senator John M. Thurston.

KENTUCKY IN LINE, TOO

A Man Thought to be a Fountain Murderer Arrested in Las Cruces, N. M.

A RAPE FIEND AT EL PASO

OMAHA, Nebraska, April 15.—State Chairman E. J. Hainer will call the republican state convention to order in the Coliseum at 6 o'clock this evening.

Hon. John L. Webster, of this city, and Peter Jensen, of Fairbury; Hon. Charles H. Gera, the veteran editor of Lincoln, and Hon. Matt A. Dougherty, of Ogallala, will be the delegates-at-large.

The indications this morning are that there will be a warm debate in the committee on resolutions on the money plank, but the free coinage republicans will be in so much of a minority in the convention that no trouble will be anticipated.

In Open Rebellion. BELLEVUE, April 15.—The whole country is now in the hands of the rebellious natives, who are massing in great force northward.

CHICAGO, Illinois, April 15.—The main building of the Chicago Fire Works Co. blew up, this morning, killing two employees and injuring six others, some of whom are horribly mangled and will die.

SAGINAW, Michigan, April 15.—The Central school building in this city burned, this morning; loss, \$100,000; insured for half that amount.

DETROIT, Mich., April 15.—The entire plant of the Michigan Beef and Provision Co., burned, this morning; loss, \$90,000; insurance, \$60,000.

DENVER, Colorado, April 15.—A fast freight train on the Santa Fe, south bound, broke in two near Larkin's Spur, this morning, and two portions of the train came violently together.

FARGO, N. Dak., April 15.—Six delegates to St. Louis, one from each of the judicial districts, will be chosen by the republican state convention this afternoon.

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M., April 15.—The report was brought up from Las Cruces last night, that Acting Sheriff Pat F. G. Grist has placed in jail there a man believed to be one of the murderers of Colonel Fountain and his boy.

El Paso, Texas, April 15.—Private Bowman, of Troop A, Fifth cavalry, stationed at Fort Bliss, was arrested in this city, today, for attempting to rape the wife of Musielon Amos, of the Eighteenth infantry.

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THE LEADERS.

"Bradley or McKinley" is the keynote with Kentucky Republicans.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., April 15.—Although Governor Bradley's boom for the presidential nomination was explicitly launched through the medium of the resolutions adopted at the meeting of the republican state central committee, on March 4th, last, it is an open question this morning whether it will be endorsed by the republican state convention which will be called to order this afternoon by Chairman Yerkes.

A compromise proposition favors a complimentary vote for Bradley, the delegation then to go to McKinley if his prospects are good, or, in the event of the selection of an eastern man, to support Governor Bradley for the second place on the ticket.

COLUMBUS, Ohio, April 15.—Republican politicians of Ohio are awaiting with eager interest the outcome of the state central committee meeting in session here, this afternoon, because of the general belief that the friction between the administration faction and the followers of McKinley, will crop out with interesting results when the committee take up the question of selecting an executive committee.

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 15.—The commissioning of the iron clad "Terror," at the Brooklyn navy-yard, today, recalls the curious fact that this vessel, though a comparatively small and unimportant addition to the navy, has been nearly a quarter of a century in building.
