WATER PURIFICATION.

One of the old delusions that is now fairly exploded by scientific research is the idea that "flowing water will purify itself in seven miles." It is a theory that has kept a great many people in a comfortable frame of mind when they might better have been worrying a little, and has probably prevented public authorities from taking precautions against the spread of typhoid fever and other diseases that they should have taken.
