The president has issued his proclamation making November 27 Thanksgiving day.

It is reported that President Huerta has notified President Wilson that some Mexicans have been arrested in the war in Colorado, and that he will hold Mr. Wilson responsible for the lives of the Mexicans in Colorado.

- State purposes, 3.60 mills.
State institutions, 5.20 mills.
Charitable institutions, 0.30 of a mill.
State road fund, 1.00 mill.
Current school fund, 0.50 of a mill.
Interest and sinking fund, 3.10 mills.
Making a total of 13.60 mills, compared with 13.50 mills last year.
