Fabulously Rico Gold Strike Reported at Pinos Altos; \$15,000 Shipment Made.

(Santa Fe New Mexican)
Silver City, N. M., Oct. 16.—The news was brought here yesterday of a fabulously rich gold strike by both the C. & O. Mining company, operating the Langston mine at Pinos Altos, and Wright and Stauber, lessees of the Pacific mine on adjoining property. Coincident with the report there was brought to a bank here, a consignment of gold ore said to be worth between \$12,000 and 15,000, taken from the Langston mine in the past week.

It is said that a vein has been encountered in the Langston mine which carries gold ore assaying thousands of dollars to the ton, and that the ore in sight indicates the owners have a bonanza that may rival the famous Comstock ledge at Virginia City, Nevada, and the rich strikes made at Goldfield.
