Morley, of Magdalena, and Victor Gulberson, of Silver City, was appointed to have charge of the districts which were made by the state tax commis-

sion and to gather data for the association from each of the districts. Each member of the committee named a representative for each county in the district and the county reports will be made at the meeting April 30.
