The London Daily Telegram in a
recent issue says: "The relations between
the House of Lords and the House of Commons
are becoming decidedly strained, to adopt the
somewhat affected phrase which has grown

seem of late to have become possessed
with a kind of frenzy for opposing and
thwarting every scheme of legislation
introduced by the Commons."

The most remarkable of all the Arctic
explorations has been that of Lieutenant
Schwatzka, of whose movements the world
has been made aware by a letter written from
Hudson's Bay by one of his party August 1st.
His search was neither for a northwest
nor northeast passage. He had no commercial
object in view, nor even the "interests of science,"
further than those could be served by the
recovery of the records of the Franklin
expedition, and even this was more in the
interest of humane history than of science,
for the sake of science. As to the records
of the Franklin expedition, he has fairly
proven that they are past recovery. It is
sorrowful to reflect, that, while expeditions
for the rescue of Franklin's party were being
fitted out as late as 1852-3, and even 1854,
the unfortunate members of that expedition
had perished from starvation in 1849.
Lieutenant Schwatzka passed over the same
ground they traversed in their effort to
escape, and where they fell man by man in
their tracks from cold, senry and starvation.
What stories of terrible agony are told by
each of the gaunt skeletons found by Schwatzka's
party! His expedition travelled three thousand
two hundred and fifty miles overland,
in the region to the north of Hudson's Bay,
occupying nearly a whole year—a spring
summer autumn and the whole of a long
Arctic winter. They withstood an intensity
of cold almost beyond parallel, one series
of twenty seven days marking 72 degrees
below the freezing point; one of 16 days
marking 100 degrees below, and on one
day marking 108 degrees below. During
this period the white men of the expedition
lived in all respects as the Esquimaux do,
and for most of the time they were on the
ground and at work.

Own A Home as Soon as You Can.
In one of his speeches Gen. George
Barstow speaking of "Homes" said:
"That philosophy which tells a man
to drift over the uncertain life without
a home is like a ship in the open sea,
at the hazard of the storm. A man
owns his home is like a ship that has
arrived in port and is moored in a safe
harbor. One man should be no more
content to live in a home that is not
his own, if he can build one, than one
bird should take the risk of hatching
in another one's nest; and for my own
part I would rather be able to own a
cottage than to hire a palace. I would
say to every man, buy a home if you
can, and own it. If a windfall has
come to you, buy a home. Do not let
any one tempt you to put all your
earnings back into the pool. Take out
enough to buy a home, and buy it.
Put the rest back if you will, gamble
on it if you must, but buy the home
first. Buy it, and sell it not. Then the
roses that bloom there are yours; the
clematis and jasmine that climb upon
the porch are yours. You have planted
them and seen them grow. When you
are at work upon them you are not
working for others. If there are children,
there are flowers within the house and
without. Buy a home."

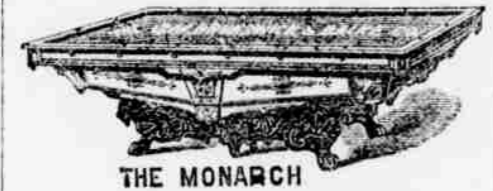

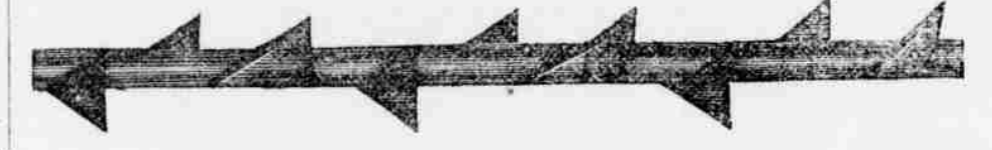
