Railroad News.

Work on the 35th Parallel Railroad is progressing in a manner which should be entirely satisfactory to the people of Northern Arizona. Grading goes on with rapidity. Activity for 250 miles west of the Rio Grande in this particular work is on the programme; rail laying in completed to Laguna, 60 miles from Albuquerque, with a mile and three-quarters added daily. In twelve months from date the iron horse will be opposite Prescott, on the 35th route, while from the sun-kissed land of the south—the home of the Montezumas—the locomotive will have come to our very doors, and aroused the denizens of the North to a realization that a new era in the history of Arizona is about to dawn upon them. The iron messenger will be welcomed by all, even the mineral hills will rejoice and open wide their vaults of gold and silver, donating freely therefrom to the stranger and civilizer coming to our relief. All hail the iron giant! will be the cry sent forth from mountain and valley home.—Arizona Miner.

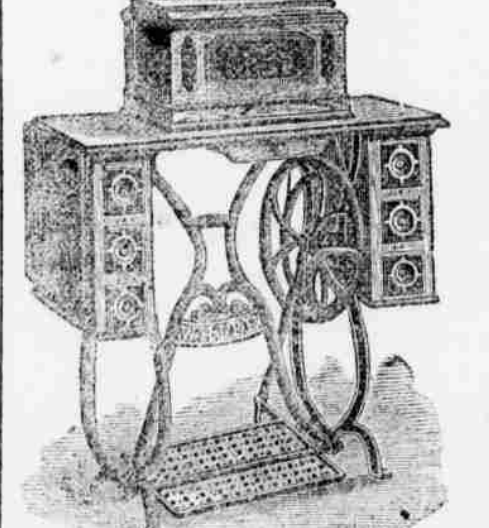
