Discussing the Causes. Ft. Wayne, Indiana, November 20.—The democratic editors of the state met here to-day to discuss the causes of the Democratic defeat and it was agreed to press upon the attention of the American people...

Canadian Pacific. New York, November 20.—The Commercial Bulletin says: "Grave apprehensions are entertained in well informed circles in Ottawa that the Canadian Pacific syndicate will be so constituted that the interests of the railway will be secondary to those of the St. Paul & Minneapolis railroad."

Foreman on Mormonism. New York, November 20.—William Foreman, announced as an apostate Mormon, who in the guise of a book canvasser had investigated Mormon life and institutions, lectured last evening at Brooklyn Tabernacle before an enormous audience on the result of his exploits.

Refused to Grant. Denver, Col., November 20.—Judge McCrary this morning refused to grant the motion of Attorney-General Wright that the case of Indian Agent Berry be transferred to the state courts.

Illinois' Vote. Chicago, Ill., November 20.—The Tribune's Springfield, Illinois special says the returns from all the counties to the state give the following result: Governor Cullom, 314,165; Trumbull, 277,582; Streeter, 28,898. Cullom's majority 37,033; plurality 83,011.

General Zelin's Future. Washington, November 20.—The funeral of Brigadier-General Zelin took place to-day. After services in the church the remains were escorted by a large detachment of military to the railroad depot for removal to Pennsylvania for interment.

The Vote of Massachusetts. Boston, Mass., November 20.—The Executive Council have announced the official canvass of the Presidential vote of this state, which is as follows: Garfield, 165,989; Hancock, 111,960; Weaver, 4546; Dow, 682.

Postponed. New York, November 21.—The unveiling of the statue of Alexander Hamilton was postponed on account of rain and fog.

Held in Jail. Danville, Ga., November 20.—The U. S. Commissioner held A. L. Davis, a judge of election in \$500 bail for rejecting the ballot of a colored man not properly registered.

BARROW BOOM.
