Washington, D. C., December 10.—Hubbed, from the appropriation committee, reported a pension bill. It was ordered printed and recommitted. It appropriates \$4,840,000 for the army, \$1,110,000 for the navy, \$250,000 for surgeons and \$25,000 for salaries.

Herbert, of Alabama, from the judiciary committee reported a bank bill allowing marshals and deputies to take bonds in certain cases referred to.

New York, December 10.—

The World's special Ottawa, Ontario dispatch says Sir John McDonald's majority in Parliament is what the commissioner called a steady factor and he can always count upon its support but Ontario, by far the richest and most important province in the confederation is alarmed at the prospect before it. The leading spirits in the syndicate are George Stephen and Donald A. Smith. The former is president of the bank of Montreal and the latter ex-Governor of the Hudson Bay Company, and owner of the St. Paul & Minneapolis railroad.

Chicago, Dec. 10.—

The Inter Ocean Washington special: Wade Hampton writes that he will not be in Washington until after the holidays. On account of the absence of fifteen unpaired democrats the party cannot elect their house officers at present. The President had a long talk with Gen. Howard, in the course of which he admitted that he had called him to Washington to make him commander at West Point, but he had been dissuaded from doing it by Gen. Sherman and Sec'y Evarts, not on account of any personal opposition to him but because they held that the change would be too violent in view of Howard's well known variance in what he regards as a correct policy as contrasted with Schofield's administration. He promised, however, he should have some good place in the east as soon as he could settle up his affairs in Oregon.

New York, December 10.—

The Times says the strict constructionists of the democratic faith will be appalled to learn that the republican secretary of state in California has discovered that the returns for presidential electors from three counties were fatally defective. He telegraphed to the local officers and advised them to send amended returns. Clearly this was not his official duty and he should have proceeded with the canvass which he is required by law to make and to have left the fatal defects to be discovered by others but this official's action, irregular though it was, saved the votes of the three counties and changed the result of the state. Democratic constructionist like Garcelon, for example, will denounce the course of the California republican secretary of state as extra constitutional. It will assuage their wrath however to learn that those counties whose votes so narrowly escaped being nullified are democratic, and that in consequence of their returns being altered Hancock secured five votes.

Washington, Dec. 10.—

A circular has been issued by the Secretary of the Treasury containing regulations governing the admission of cadets into the revenue marine service. The circular states that a certain standard of proficiency will be fixed and if candidates fall below such standard they will be rejected. They may, however, receive a second examination, at next annual meeting of board of examiners. A failure on second examination will result in final rejection of candidate. While applicants as a rule will be accorded not more than two examinations, exceptions may be made granting third examination in particular cases. Where candidates have passed two examinations successfully they will be appointed for a probationary period of two years, during which they will be required to pursue prescribed course of study and perform such duties on board ship or elsewhere in service as may be required of them. At the end of two years they will, if their probationary service be satisfactory, be examined for promotion to grade 3d lieutenant in revenue marine.

Chicago, Dec. 10.—

The Times recommending Utah thinks neither provisional government nor disfranchisement of polygamists a practical remedy, but says: "It is a question whether it would not be better to establish a military government at once and administer the affairs of the territory directly by national authority, until polygamy has been rooted out and material for a state, founded on the principles of republican institutions, has been introduced. No half-way measures are likely to succeed and no putting with the subject is desirable. Utah is still in the hands of the federal government and it should take the most effective means of preparing it for its destined place in the union of states."

New Orleans, Dec. 10.—The Quarantine Convention unanimously resolved that its general government defray all the organization expenses of quarantine which extends beyond the boundaries of single states, and they ask for appropriations from congress. Adjourned to meet next December. In the American Health Association Dr. Henry Gibbons was appointed the California member of advisory committee.

Richmond, Va., Dec. 10.—

The Grand Jury in the federal court indicted three election judges at Manchester, Va., for refusing to take votes because they alleged that the computation tax was illegally issued from the state auditor's office.

San Francisco, Dec. 10.—

The habeas corpus case of Killoch was continued until tomorrow. The court took no action in the matter of alleged contempt of court in the case of the Mexican General Buot, for resisting the sheriff.

Madrid, Dec. 10.—

The Imperial says that Spain ought to conclude a treaty with the United States and if the United States will reduce the duty on Cuban sugar and Spanish fruit Spain will reduce the duty on American cereals and flour.

New York, Dec. 10.—

The Bulletin says that the raising of the rate of interest by the Bank of England is warning that no further large amount of gold will come to America from London with the consent of the bank.

Chicago, Dec. 10.—

A Daily News special from Sherbrooke, Que., says that Wm. Gray was hanged there this morning for the murder of Thos. Mulligan. He died protesting his innocence of the crime.

Philadelphia, Dec. 10.—

The Philadelphia national council of the Union League held their annual meeting here to-day. Gen. J. S. Negley, of Pittsburg, was elected President, the other officers being re-elected.

Bryan, Texas, Dec. 10.—

On the farm of Col. John Morris, on the Brazo river, Henry William's wife and child have died since Sunday last from eating poisoned beef. Four others of the family are sick.

Chicago, Dec. 10.—

Wheat ruled lower at closing, being quoted at 102. Whisky one cent lower, closing price 112.

Lawrence, Mass., December 10.—

Captain Timothy Dorsey, a noted Fenian leader, died this afternoon.

Washington, Dec. 10.—

The house committee agreed on a pension bill appropriating \$50,000,000.

New York, Dec. 10.—

Despite the cool weather the thermometer is seven degrees above zero.

Berlin, Dec. 10.—

The Imperial Bank of Germany shows a decrease in specie of 150,000 marks.

New York, Dec. 10.—

The "Europe" brought two million f. aces.
