Colorado Cullings.

Denver has 200 licensed liquor establishments.

The new coal mining camp at Como is steadily growing to be a large and lively town.

Three hundred head of cattle perished a few weeks ago on Santa Clara creek, Huerfano county.

The G. A. R. Posts are electing delegates to the department encampment at Laramie City, Wyoming.

There is not much snow in North Park, but the weather is very cold. Stock is doing well over there.

Frying Pan gulch is about six miles west from Leadville, and commences half a mile north of Soda Springs.

An organization has been formed in Denver to fight any ordinance prohibiting the sale of liquor on Sunday.

Denver Germans have incorporated a company to publish a weekly newspaper to be called the Sunday Post.

A herd of about 300 mountain bison came into North Park from the west side recently. Many of them were killed.

Incendiary fires are on the increase in Denver. Two more occurred last Friday night, and rewards are offered for the arrest of the fire bugs.

Herman Beckhurst has resigned his position as President and Treasurer of the Denver Tribune Publishing Co. and is succeeded by Herman Silver.

The new Methodist temple in Idaho Springs, one of the handsomest church edifices in the mountains, will be ready for the dedicatory within a few days.

A bold forger James Vizey has been captured in Denver. He is also wanted in Leadville for embezzlement and also in other places on various other charges.

Colorado Springs tramps recently took possession of an elegantly furnished cottage that had been closed for the winter until the neighbors discovered them.

Col. John Cleghorn, aged fifty, a well known man and prominently connected with various enterprises in the San Juan country, died in Del Norte on the 18th.

Gen. D. J. Cook was confirmed chief of police in Denver after an exciting session of the city council. The vote finally stood seven to five. The department is to be re-organized.

Several to-den saloon keepers have anticipated the proposed action of the city council by posting placards in their premises with the legend, "positively no minors allowed here."

Ranchmen along Bear creek state, or some of them do, that the rainy cattle are dying while those designated as mountain stock are in a fair way to live through the winter.

The first contract for work on the Denver, Utah & Pacific railroad has been awarded. The route will be determined by survey. Not less than 100 miles are to be constructed each year.

A fine large hotel is shortly to be erected at Idaho Springs for the accommodation of boarders and tourists. Water from one of the hot springs will be conveyed to the hotel in pipes.

A laborer of the Blind Tom near Leadville, put a pair of mules in the barn adjacent to the shaft house, and on going out left his lighted candle, which kept on burning. Loss, \$3,000 and the mules.

The chopping and hauling furnishes employment for fully one hundred men in the neighborhood of Fairplay just now. The ties are strung for over two-thirds of the distance between Fairplay and Garo.

A hoisting engine and pump has just been put up on one of the Mosquito Range Mining company's claims on New England gulch, Park county. The shaft thus provided is on the Harlem lode and is now 122 feet deep.

The railroad surveying party that went through Bear Creek district a few weeks ago left an impression on the mind of the settlers that the cars of the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy are to be running along Bear Creek in a few days.

A big boom is predicted for next year for the gold district that extends from the eastern slope of Mount Lincoln near Montgomery and Quartzville and thence across North Star mountain into the Pollock district in Summit county.

The annual ball of Hook and Ladder company No. 1 of Denver will be given on Christmas eve. It will be the farewell hop of the company, as before the end of another year will have arrived it will be disorganized to make way for the paid department.

A highly sensational wedding took place on the stage at Silver Plume last week during a performance. The contracting parties were Charles Theodore and Bille Leslie, the former manager of the company and both well-known theatrical people.

A committee of the Denver city council on public buildings is shortly to visit the large cities of the east to see what they can learn of advantage to their city. They will be accompanied by the city engineer who will examine the sewerage systems etc.
