Cabinet Chatter.

Washington, Jan. 4.—Ex-Senator Mitchell of Oregon denies in letters published in the local press that he has any aspirations for a cabinet position. He says that he thinks that Garfield ought to select one cabinet officer from the region west of the Rocky Mountains, in justice to its business interests, wholly regardless of political considerations, but, he adds, as he is advised Oregon has not presented any name in this connection.

The knowing ones assign the interior department under Garfield at the Pacific slope, or some far-western state like Colorado, with Gov. Rout as the most likely subject for the choice to fall upon.

Statements are put forth with much positiveness that Senator Don Cameron, on being tired of the senate will be given his former position as secretary of war.

It is not thought that the south will have any repressiveatives in the cabinet. It is generally believed that the vacant secretaryship of the navy has been offered to Representative L. P. Morton of New York, and declined by him, although accompanied by an assurance that Garfield would retain him. It is now considered somewhat probable that Chief Clerk Hogg will be nominated to the unexpired term.

Ireland for the Irish.

Cork, Jan. 3.—Daniels, the man who was shot and dangerously wounded by a party of men who visited his house, persistently refuses to tell the police who the men were that fired on him or the reason for the violence.

IRELAND ARMING.

London, Jan. 3.—It is stated that a thousand guns are sent to Ireland surreptitiously from Birmingham weekly and that within the last three weeks 5,000 Enfield rifles have been sent there from the Birmingham shops.

There is small basis for the rumors that the Fenians intend to seize arms in the north of England; precautions, however, are being taken. The police patrol in county Sligo, Ireland on the night of the 2d exchanged shots with an armed party. It is supposed that one of the prowlers was wounded; two were arrested.

A stringent peace preservation bill will undoubtedly be introduced in the British house of commons to endeavor, if possible, to stop disturbances in Ireland.

One of the largest land meetings ever held in Ireland took place in county Galway on Sunday.

Crusade Against the Jews.

Berlin, Jan. 4.—On the morning of the 1st large crowds of people, mainly made up of students, made a demonstration before a cafe in Berlin, much frequented by Jews. They broke in the windows and mobbed all Jews that they met. The police was comparatively helpless. Another cafe was invaded and emptied of Jews. Large and stormy meetings continue to be held and the crusade seems to be gaining force.

Reports received here of demonstrations in the United States, with the object of protesting against the anti-Jewish agitation is unfavorably commented on. The feeling here is that Germany can tolerate no intervention in her affairs from foreign powers.

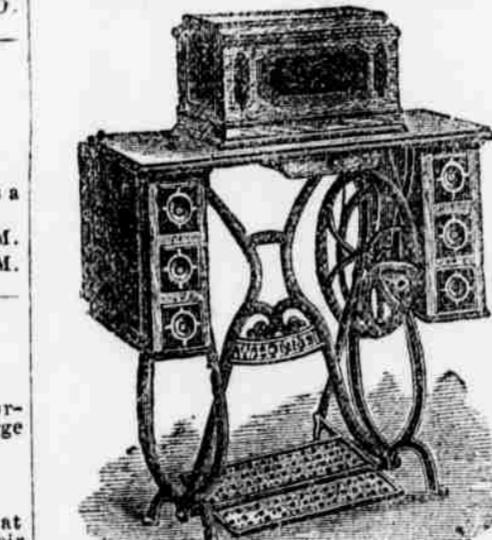
