Her Neighbors and The Life of Sir Phillip Sidney should be regarded as containing passages unfit for children to read. Dr. Billings evidently is an admirer of the gallant Sir Phillip, for in the library is a list of the English counties by J. Addison Seymour, which Dr. Billings himself presented to the Institution.

There is a chapter in this book, which is by an Englishman and belongs to a series edited by Sir John Murray, in which is set forth the story of the adoration of the soldier and poet and friend of Queen Elizabeth for lady Rich. Thought Fit Here Mrs. Bishop at one time was displeased to criticize missionaries adversely, but her travels in Corea appear to have brought her to a more favorable view of them. The book has had a wide circulation among church members in this country and is handled in this city by Fleming H. Revell Co., who make a specialty of supplying Sunday school libraries with suitable and beautiful literature. The English publisher is John Murray of London. The idea that the work should be considered as unfit for the young person was received with astonishment by the New York publishers.

The Story of the Fox, also under the pen, is not issued to the young in this country, and no objection could be found who had a record of it. The youth of the country may find Macaulay's essay on Lord Clive a little long and arduous, but they take an interest in his narrative character.

The biography which is in the most demand in New York among the boys is that of Lincoln, while Washington stands second in this. Many all books issued to the young person at the branches of the public library must pass a rigid censorship before they are placed on the shelves.
