BIG DISTILLERY FOR ALBUQUERQUE POSSIBLE

Local Men May Begin Man-
ufacture of Booze Which
Will Rival That Made in
Old Kentucky.

That a whiskey distillery is to be
a new enterprise for Albuquerque in
the near future, is the persistent re-
port current in the business section
for some days past. It is said that a
number of local capitalists have got
together on the proposition and that
a company will be organized and in-
corporated for the purpose of distribut-
ing spirituous liquors of various kinds.
Some of the men behind the venture,
it is said, have had experience in
manufacturing booze in the southern
states and providing they go into the
business here, are prepared to turn
out an article which will compare
favorably with the brands manufac-
tured in the old time distilling districts
in the east and south.

Jose Duran is a fugitive from Justice
and Cruz Sanchez lies in a cot at St. Joseph's hospital with a
severe knife wound in his abdomen
as the result of an early morning
brawl in Barcelas Sunday. Just now
Sanchez was stabbed is not known.

He claims that the knifing was done
by Duran, and as the latter could not
be located when officers searched for
him it is taken for granted by the au-
thorities that he is the guilty man.

Sanchez and Duran were compadres
and went out Saturday night for a
"time." It is said both drunks con-
sumed booze, had a falling out in a
Barcelas saloon and the stabbing fol-
lowed. Deputy Sheriff Romulo Urena
made an extended search for Duran
yesterday and today but was not
successful in locating him. It is be-
lieved he made his getaway to the
country, where he is being taken care
of by relatives.

A warrant charging Duran with as-
sassination with intent to kill was sworn
out before Salcedo Arribalzaga, justice of
the peace of Precinct No. 5, yesterday
afternoon.

Sanchez was reported as resting
easy this afternoon, but it is by no
means certain that he will recover.

about four days.

made to enter the various commercial
organizations in the plan with a
view of making it an annual feature.
