MIDNIGHT BRAWL CULMINATES IN STABBING

Cruz Sanchez Has Stiletto Stuck Into Him in Burelas Early Sunday; Assailant Escapes.

Jose Duran is a fugitive from justice and Cruz Sanchez lies on a cot in St. Joseph's hospital with a severe knife wound in his abdomen as the result of an early morning brawl in Burelas Sunday. Just how Sanchez was stabbed is not known. He claims that the knife was done by Duran, and as the latter could not be located when officers searched for him it is taken for granted by the authorities that he is the guilty man. Sanchez and Duran were companions and went out Saturday night for a "time". It is said both drank considerable booze, had a falling out in a Burelas saloon and the stabbing followed. Deputy Sheriff Romulo Urbiain made an extended search for Duran yesterday and today but was not successful in locating him. It is believed he made his getaway to the country, where he is being taken care of by relatives.

A warrant charging Duran with assault with intent to kill was sworn out before Supt. Antonio Arriba, justice of the peace of Precinct No. 3 yesterday afternoon.

Sanchez was reported as resting easy this afternoon, but it is by no means certain that he will recover.

ACCOMMODATIONS ALL TAXED TO LIMIT

Every Available Berth is Occupied on Most Santa Fe Through Trains; Vacations for Students and Workers.

Record crowds are continuing on their eastward way and every train passing through here is crowded. For three days there has hardly been a vacant Pullman section, while the tourist sleepers are also crowded to capacity.

The price that the Santa Fe is offering to win is a valuable one, amounting to several thousand dollars' worth of government mail contracts for handling messages out of Chicago. The Rock Island will make its trial run after the Santa Fe finishes. The time made by the latter so far has been better than 20 miles an hour.

Railroad lines centering in California are said to be back at a point to send "flower" trains to the east during the winter. The Pacific coast has at once surprised and pleased the world with its beautiful floral festivals. Now it is proposed to expand this splendid advertising feature and at a time of the year when the east is wrapped in the snow and ice of midwinter, trains loaded with flowers will be sent to various centers of population east of the Rocky mountains.
