CATTLE PRICES LOWER Kansas City Stock Yards, June 14.—Four grades of cattle added a little to their world last week account of the growing variety of that kind, but the lower grades of beef cattle, especially those on the skipper order, and from dry sections, ran 19 to 15 cents for the week. ANONYMOUS LETTER REVEALS CRIME

Infant Found Buried in Cellar of Hartford House; After Police Receive Unsigned Note Telling of Burial.

Hartford, Conn., June 14.—As the result of finding the body of an infant buried in a cellar at No. 117 Madison avenue Saturday evening, two arrests have been made. Frederick W. Traver, who lives at that address, is held on a charge of assault and battery under bonds of \$1,000, and his partner, Mrs. Sarah Mott, who the police say is the mother of the child, is in St. Francis hospital, where she was sent yesterday by Police Sergeant F. A. Egan. The first indication the police had of the affair was when Prosecuting Attorney Edwin F. Dickinson got an anonymous letter, stating that a child had been killed and buried at that address. During the day no headway could be made until Dr. Egan made an examination of the woman and found that her statement that she was not a mother to be false.

Last night Detective Sergeant McLaughlin went to the place and began a search. In the cellar, which had a cement floor, he found the child had been broken in one corner. He peered up the stairs and found down upon those feet, found the body. An attempt will be permissibly to ascertain whether the child was alive at the time of death. If it was, the mother will probably be charged with murder. Traver pleaded ignorance of the presence of the body in the house, but he was held in custody of the present. It is said that the child was born last Saturday morning.

Mrs. Mott is 25 years old and it is said that she is the mother of eight children, four of whom are living in institutions in this state. Her husband lives in New York.
