Commanding Officer of United States Army Post Asks for List of Wholesale and Retail Houses.

INSTRUCTED TO BUY NEAR HOME IF POSSIBLE

The wholesale and retail merchants of Albuquerque will hereafter have an opportunity to bid on supplies of every kind purchased by the United States for Post Wingate, an army post west of Albuquerque. Secretary Thomas J. Naylor of the Commercial club has received a request from the commanding officer at Post Wingate asking for a list of the wholesale and retail houses in Albuquerque, with the explanation that instructions have been issued that supplies for the post be purchased as near home as possible. Mr. Naylor is compiling a list of the various shops and stores and will submit it to the commanding officer.

If the prices advanced by the Albuquerque merchants are right, it is likely they will do quite a business with Wingate, as large purchases of various kinds are made for that post during the year.
