Bailey was lifted because he must be saved for tomorrow. Ruth Woods relieved him and went the other two innings, the game being called at the end of the seventh. The feature of the game was the star work of Phelan of the Southern league, who got five hits out of five times up, including three two baggers and a home run. Phelan, who led the Southern league in base stealing, stole home once and second once.
