The city of Albuquerque has been divided into four voting districts, two in each precinct, and voters should see to it that they are properly registered before Saturday, October 29, at which time the registration books will be closed. The registration books are located as follows: For that part of Precinct 12 east of Second street, the New Mexico Cigar company store, 113 West Central avenue. For the rest of that precinct, at B. Ruppe's drug store, Registration for the east half of Precinct 26, at the Alvarado Pharmacy, First street and Gold avenue. For the west half of 26, at Vann's drug store, Second street and Gold avenue.
Voters should register now and avoid much unnecessary trouble after the books have been closed.
