150 ACRES SOLD BY ATRISCO FARMS

St. Louis Business Man Starts the Raising of Alfalfa on Good Tract South of This City.

A tract of 150 acres has been sold by the Atrisco farms to Fred B. Hornby, a St. Louis business man, and Mr. Hornby has begun leveling the land in preparation for raising alfalfa on the whole tract. The sale was completed last week, and the actual leveling was begun Monday morning, says Victor A. D. Ogle, who spent several days setting stakes for the work.

Mr. Hornby's tract is right next the lake road, and is about five miles south of the city. It is under \$200,000. He expects to spend a total of \$200,000 in the purchase of the land, leveling and improving it, and in the erection of a brick house.

TURKS SLAUGHTER BULGARIANS AT ISHTIB

Bomb Was Exploded in a Mosque There on December 4 and Rioting Comes As Revenge on Suspects.

Leased Wire) Constantinople, Dec. 5.—Serious rioting has occurred at Ishtib, about 90 miles north of Salonika, consequent on the bomb outrage in a mosque there on December 4, when twelve persons were killed and twenty wounded. The Turks for revenge attacked the Bulgarians, whom they accuse of being the perpetrators of the outrage, killing fourteen and wounding 175.
