GERMANS FORCED TO GIVE GROUND TO THE SLAVS DISTANCE OF SOME TWELVE MILES

Petrograd Official Statement Reports Effective Assaults on von Hindenburg's Forces; Russians Near Erzingan.

BRITISH CLAIM SUCCESS IN TOWN OF POZIERES

French Airmen Flies Across Germany, Dropping Proclamations in Berlin, but Is Captured Near Northern Lines.

The Evening Herald London Wire. London reports important advances gained by the British in their fight for Pozieres, the present focal point of their attack in the Somme region. A large portion of the town is now in British hands. General Sir Douglas Haig reports gains of ground near High Wood and in the vicinity of Guillemont on the British left flank. The reports of German counter attacks between High Wood and Guillemont are reported.

Petrograd dispatches say Field Marshal von Hindenburg's forces in the Riga region have been driven back twelve miles. Petrograd also officially reports continued gains on the southern front, announcing that Russian fronts have pushed back the Turks to within fifteen miles of Erzingan.

A Turkish official communication announces the defeat of a British cavalry force east of Suez. A French aviator, according to an official announcement in Paris, has flown across Germany and dropped proclamations in Berlin. Later reports forced the flyer to earth in Poland when, within sixty miles of his objective, the Russian lines he was captured. He had flown 497 miles from Nancy, his starting point, to Berlin.

GERMANS FORCED BACK AS MUCH AS TWELVE MILES. The Germans have been driven back twelve miles at one point on the Riga front, according to a Russian dispatch from Petrograd. The dispatch says that the fighting went on without pause for four days prior to Sunday. It has now halted as the Russians require time to consolidate the gained ground and the Germans are waiting for reinforcements.

GERMAN AND BRITISH MOSQUITO CRAFT ENGAGE. London, July 24. (U. P. M. T. S.) Six German torpedo boat destroyers were engaged in a running fight by British light forces off Scarborough, according to an official statement issued by the British admiralty this afternoon. The German vessels were reportedly hit but they succeeded in reaching the Belgian coast.

BERLIN ASSERTS BRITISH GAINS SUNDAY WERE SMALL. Berlin, July 24. (U. P. M. T. S.) The only advantage gained by the British Sunday, says the German official statement, issued today, was the penetration of a few trenches in the village of Pozieres for which they paid with heavy and constant losses.

BRITISH CAVALRY BEATEN BY TURKS NEAR CANAL. Constantinople, July 24. (U. P. M. T. S.) A British cavalry detachment of Turkish forces east of Suez, near the canal, is announced by army headquarters in today's official statement. The British lost towards the canal pursued by the Turks. British detachments advanced west of Katta, thirty miles from the canal, were driven off by the Turkish skirmishers.

ITALIAN ATTACKS MAKING GOOD PROGRESS, IS REPORTED. Rome, July 24. (U. P. M. T. S.) Italian attacks in the Ancona region to gain possession of Ancona, Italy, are making good progress, according to the Italian official statement issued today. The Ancona defenses last before the summer were captured yesterday.

RUSSIAN CLAIM STEADY ADVANCE ON ERZINGAN. Petrograd, July 24. (U. P. M. T. S.) Russian advances in Turkish Armenia are steadily making progress, according to a Russian official statement issued today.

DEUTSCHLAND CLOSELY GUARDED BEFORE DASH TO SEA

On the east, the Russian advance guards are within fifteen miles of the place, which is eight miles southwest of Pozieres.

BRITISH CLAIM CAPTURE OF PART OF POZIERES

London, July 24. (U. P. M. T. S.) British troops have captured a large part of the village of Pozieres, says the official British statement issued this afternoon. They also gained some ground near High Wood in the direction of Guillemont. The night statement adds was comparatively calm.

RUSSIAN REPORT GAIN OF FIVE MILES AT RIGA

London, July 24. (U. P. M. T. S.) A dispatch to Reuters' Telegram company from Petrograd says: "An advance of five miles is reported on the left wing of the Riga sector. General von Lanning's forces are now on the line and Lipa's are reported to be at least fifteen miles out of the three corps engaged."

The Russians are on the point of entering the northern corner of the town. General Boehme-Kunz and General Count von Bothmer being outflanked both on the north and south. The heights captured in the Riga sector are only four miles from the summit of the cathedrals and the Hungarian frontier in the district of Matras-Szent.

The official statement issued at 2:25 o'clock yesterday afternoon says: "The battle has been resumed today all along the German front. From Pozieres to Guillemont and reached a stage of intense fighting."

In the neighborhood of Pozieres, British and Australian troops are looking from the southwest and southward, respectively, across the German outer works by small short-cut roads. Intense fighting now is taking place in the village, where the Germans are offering a desperate resistance with large numbers of machine guns.

On other parts of the battle front the fighting is equally intense and here no definite progress is reported. At one time this morning we had recaptured the whole of Longueval, but the enemy once more regained the northern end of the village. The British, the outskirts of Guillemont are already have twice changed hands."

TWO BRITISH STEAMSHIPS SUNK, BOTH CREWS SAVED

London, July 24. (U. P. M. T. S.) The British steamer, *Blondeau*, and *Kingston* have been sunk. The crews of both vessels were saved.

The *Blondeau* was a vessel of 1,000 tons. She was built in 1902 and was owned in Cardiff. She was last reported as having arrived in Naples June 27 from Italy.

TELEONS FAIL TO BREAK SLAV LINES IN VOLHYNIA

Petrograd, July 24. (U. P. M. T. S.) Russian troops in Volhynia tried Saturday night to break the Russian line along the river Stokhod, near Berestechko, 25 miles northwest of Kiev. The attack was repulsed and the Russian line was completely repulsed.

BERLIN REPORTS CHECK TO SLAVS OFFENSIVE

Berlin, July 24. (U. P. M. T. S.) Further attacks by the Russians in strong forces have been made on the Teutonic lines north-west of Berestechko, in southern Volhynia near the Galician border. The Russian efforts to advance, however, were completely repulsed.
