**Soldiers of Czar Launch Movement in Turkish Armenia and Claim to Have Made Advances Along a Wide Front.**

## OTTOMAN FORCES ARE DEALT A HEAVY BLOW

**Slaves Continue Their Determined Struggle for Lemberg; Petrograd Reports Capture of a Number of Hostile Positions.**

(By Evening Herald Special Wire) The Russians have broken out with a new offensive in Turkish Armenia reporting an advance on a wide front extending from the Black sea coast west of Trabzon to the interior. The Russian fleet co-operated with the land forces in the fighting along the coast.

In the Kars region the Russians carried a fortified position and west of Rukh-Tulchik, 25 miles southwest of Trabzon broke through the Turkish advance and inflicted heavy losses in men and material damage upon the Ottoman forces.

Along the 125 mile front from Van to the Black sea coast, the Russians are continuing their determined struggle for Lemberg. For the first time in several days Petrograd today reports progress announcing that hostile positions at various points have been captured during the progress of the offensive.

**Main Building of the Christian Brothers' Institution Is Gutted by Flames and Two Aged Members of Faculty Are Missing.**

## NURSE PLUNGES FROM A WINDOW AND IS INJURED

**Fourth Floor of the Building Collapses and Firemen Fall to the Basement; Three Recovered; Others in Wreckage.**

(By Evening Herald Special Wire) St. Louis, Oct. 5.—Fire today destroyed the main building of Christian Brothers' college here. Two aged members of the college faculty are missing and are believed to have perished, and an assistant nurse, who jumped from an upper window, was seriously hurt.

All the faculty except two and all students were accounted for. Most of the students had not arrived for the day's work when the fire started.

The two faculty members who are missing are another father, 72 years old, and another, 72 years old. Their room on the fifth floor of the infirmary was swept by the fire, and it is not thought either could have escaped. The assistant nurse, who was injured, was Lewis Nelson, who jumped from a fifth story window in the infirmary. It is thought that his injuries will prove fatal.

The loss is estimated at more than \$300,000. On the roof of the building was one of the most elaborate wireless stations in the United States. Two wings of the building were saved, and the part destroyed was the central section, the original college building.

Abbeduto from the fourth floor of the college building collapsed and seven by seven, falling into the street below. Three were taken out badly injured. Others are in the wreckage.
