- Exam. No. 2—Examinations in which competitors are assembled for school tests.
- March 12, assistant superintendent of drug and oil plant station (male), \$1,200 to \$1,500.
- March 12, April 3 and May 7, accounting and statistical clerk (male and female), \$1,200 to \$1,420.
- February 13, forest and forest clerk (male and female), \$2,100 to \$1,500.
- April 5, clerk and recorder (male and female), \$1,000 to \$1,100.

**R. R. EMPLOYEES IN ARMY WILL RETAIN THEIR SENIORITY**

Information Reaches Local Railroad Offices That Director General Says Men Can Return to Their Former Jobs.

A number of local Santa Fe employees today received information from Washington determining the status of soldiers and sailors who are re-enlistees of the railroads. The information received is to the effect that William G. McAdoo, before he resigned as director general, went on record in favor of giving the returning soldier the position he held on the railroad before entering service. McAdoo's announcement follows:

"The majority of railroads under federal control have already made an announcement with respect to the preservation of seniority rights for employees who have entered the military service of the government and have indicated that so far as practicable preference in re-employment or reinstatement would be given to soldiers and sailors when returned out of the service."

"It is noted that no nearly as preferable there shall be a uniform treatment of this matter, the following general principles will govern:

"In the case of an employee having established seniority rights, so far as practicable, and where the employee is physically qualified, he will be restored to his former position."

"In the case of employees who do not have seniority rights under existing conditions a consistent effort will be made to provide employment for them when returned out of military service."

"Upon railroads where the assurance given at this subject has been more specific than the provisions of paragraph (1) hereof, such assurance shall be observed."

A returning soldier, who left a position with a railroad company in order to enter the army, and who wants his old job back should return to his old employer, as mentioned out, and the chances are that he will find his job waiting for him.
