Articles of Incorporation. The following articles of incorporation have been filed in the office of J. W. Reynolds, secretary of the Territory:

The Burro Chief Copper Company. The incorporators are Thomas S. Parker, Catherine J. Parker, Arthur S. Goodall, all of Silver City, New Mexico. The objects of this corporation are to locate, buy, sell, operate and develop mines, mining properties, ores, real and personal property, timber, water rights, mills, mill sites, general merchandise and other property; to mill, smelt, concentrate and reduce all kinds of ores. The capital stock is \$100,000 divided into 1,000 shares at \$100 each. The term of existence is 50 years and the principal place of business, Silver City. The number of directors shall be three, and those who will manage the business of this company for the first three months are Thomas S. Parker, Catherine J. Parker, and Arthur S. Goodall.

Certificate of Non-Liability. The Burro Chief Copper Company has filed a certificate of non-liability of its stockholders stating that their personal property cannot be taken to offset any liabilities of the corporation.

Articles of Incorporation of Foreign Company.

The following articles of incorporation of a foreign company have been filed in the office of J. W. Reynolds, secretary of the Territory:

The Union-Esperanza Mining Company, of Arizona. The incorporators are John S. Miller, Lincoln Davis, Chalapa G. Goss, Willard L. Long and John M. Mulford, all of Phoenix, Arizona. The purpose of this corporation are to make contracts, to purchase, lease, bond, locate, or otherwise acquire, own, exchange, sell or otherwise dispose of; pledge, mortgage, hypothecate and deal in, real estate and all kinds of personal property, mines, mining claims, oil lands, mineral lands, oil, gas, asphaltum, petroleum, asbestos, salt, water or water rights and machinery to mine, work, explore, operate and develop same. The capital stock is \$500,000, divided into 500,000 shares at \$1 each. The term of existence is 25 years. The principal place of business in the Territory is Shandon, Sierra County, and J. W. Yaple is named as agent. The number of directors, shall be five, and those who will manage the business of the company for the first three months are John S. Miller, Lincoln Davis, Chalapa G. Goss, Willard L. Long and John M. Mulford.
