EXCURSIONS TO CLIFF DWELLINGS

Archaeological Society Hopes in This Way to Encourage People to Make Interesting Trip.

At the meeting of the Archaeological Society on last Friday evening, Mr. and Mrs. Ross McMillan, Mrs. Corbin, Miss DuVal and Messrs. Harvie and Hugh DuVal were elected to membership. The following officers for the ensuing year were elected: President, J. R. McFie; vice president, L. Bradford Prince; secretary Paul A. F. Walter; corresponding secretary, Mrs. James E. Wood; treasurer, A. H. Brodhead.

The committee on excursions to the cliff dwellings presented an interesting report, which was adopted. It is as follows:

July 5, 1907.

Hon. John R. McFie, president Archaeological Society of Santa Fe.

Dear Sir—Your committee on cliff dwelling tours reports as follows:

After having gone thoroughly over this subject in various meetings profiting by the hard work of a similar committee last year and the experience of those who have made trips to this region during the year just past, we outline the following plan for the semi-monthly trip for the approval and support of the Society and for any improvements that they have to suggest; First trip to be taken for two days, Friday and Saturday, July 12 and 13 to be personally conducted by A. B. Craycraft, who will go on horse-back. In order to cover a condition, if the trips become popular. Mr. Craycraft will educate a new guide to undertake the trips at such times as it will be impossible for Mr. Craycraft to go. Trips to be only run when five or more passengers agree to go and rates to apply to men, women and children alike, and no party to consist of more than fifteen paid passengers. Rates \$5 a day or \$10 for the round trip of two days to be paid to Mr. Craycraft on departure, however, residents of Santa Fe, members of the Archaeological Society, for their first trip will be charged but \$4 a day. On the basis of five passengers to a six-seated rig, six persons with the driver, we figure: Three seated rig and driver.....\$12 One guide \$5 a day..... 10 Tent and wagon sheet, hire or part payment on purchase..... 4 Cook, Indian to meet party at Buckman..... 2 Provisions..... 10 Cooking utensils, hire or part payment on purchase..... 1 Incidentals..... 1 Total.....\$40

Balance to be paid into the treasury of the Archaeological Society to further its work in opening up the Cliff Dwelling region in this vicinity to the interest and knowledge of the public \$10. Total \$50.

Fare of five persons at \$5 a day for two days' trip \$50. If for any set of circumstances the trip is extended for longer than this time, it will be at the same rate, namely \$5 a day. In all cases passengers must provide their own bedding and if it should be that a cot was necessary, they must provide a folding cot; in other words, the rate to each passenger will be \$5 a day and their own bedding. In this connection it is well to state that the committee is well aware that great economy would be brought about, by having a ranger's cabin erected for the use of the society in this region, in which tents, bedding, feed for horses and non-perishable provisions could be stored, and we recommend that if the trips prove at all successful that definite steps be taken to have such a cabin erected. In the hiring of the three-seated rigs, if it is possible, it will be well to hire the first from Charles Closson, and if more are needed, the second from Theodore Corrick and the third from Mr. Closson. It would be possible to take seven or eight passengers if two or three would go on horse back but we have not found out what a horse would cost for a two-day trip.

It is not the purpose of this committee to commit the Archaeological Society to running Cliff Dwelling tours, but merely to demonstrate that these trips are feasible, in the hopes that private parties will take it up as a business. Mrs. Laughlin on behalf of this committee will report on the signs and hotel cards.

It was decided to run the first excursion on next Friday and Saturday upon the terms and conditions set forth in the above report, A. B. Craycraft to take personal charge.

Semi-monthly trips of two days' duration to the cliff dwelling region will be begun by the Archaeological Society on Friday, July 12th under the personal supervision of Mr. A. B. Craycraft. Rates \$5 a day or \$10 for the round trip. Passengers must take their own bedding.

BERNALILLO TO SUE SANDOVAL COUNTY.

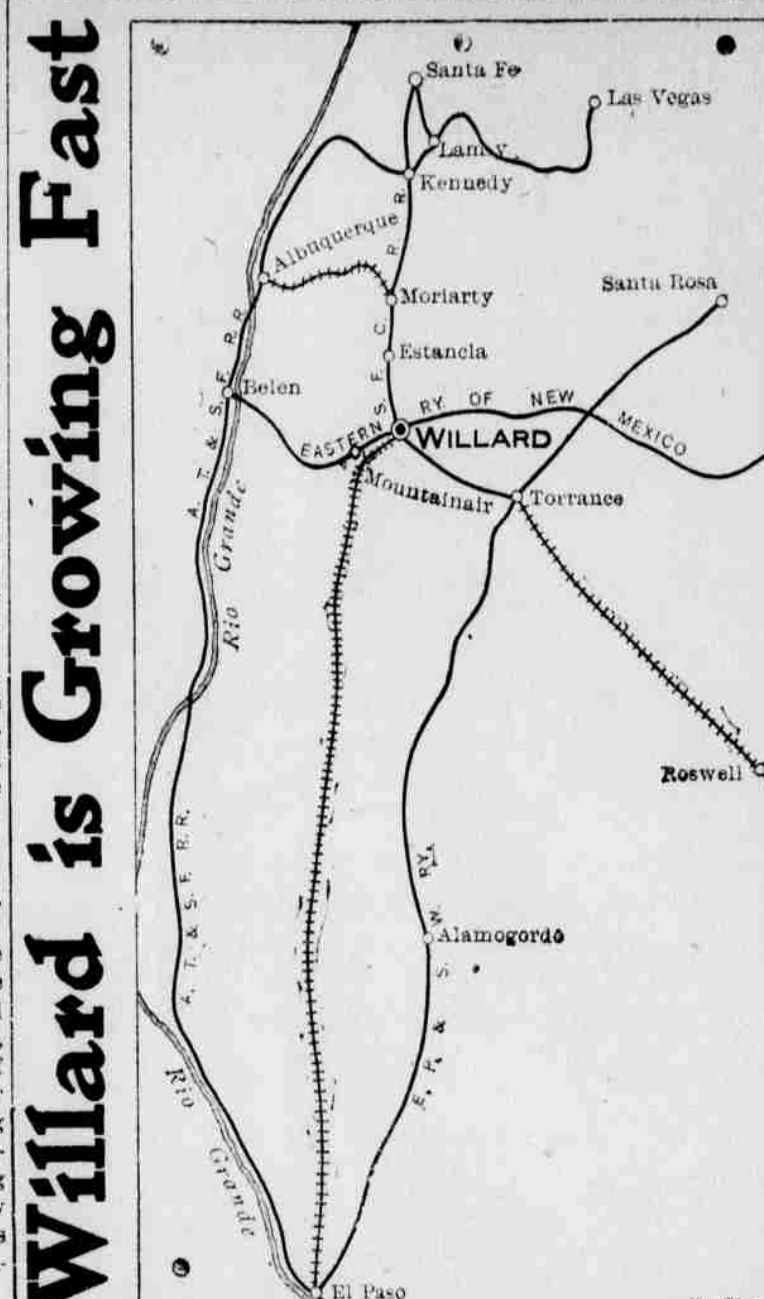
