CARRIZOZO NEEDS MORE RESIDENCES

Lack of Desirable Houses Retards Progress of Thrifty Railroad Division Point.

Carrizozo, N. M., Oct. 26.—Carrizozo needs a capitalist who will erect residence houses for the many wanting to rent in this place. The town is being handicapped for want of desirable houses. All that are now being constructed are engaged far ahead.

The Capitan school resumed last Monday after having been closed on account of a scarlet fever scare. The cases are all reported as recovered and there is no danger of an epidemic. A United States army recruiting station has been opened here, the headquarters are in the First National bank building and the recruiting officer in charge of E. Babcock.

The new Baptist church is now completed. The present structure is only a temporary building, which will serve for the next year or two. The Rev. R. H. Pope has been the minister in charge up to this time, but arrangements will soon be made for a settled pastor.

E. R. Keeley and son, Edward, are erecting a feed store and transfer barn and will soon be ready for business.

T. H. Lindsay of Chicago, and W. B. Higby of Dalhart, Texas, are in the city. These men are associated with V. A. McIvers in the Calumet mine and will be here some time. The company has a very promising copper mine.

Rev. John A. Land and Rev. Joseph Lind, father and son, respectively, reached in this city last Sunday. The ministers are from Mountainair, Torrance county, where they have settled on homesteads.

J. W. Long has been appointed United States court commissioner at that place.

W. N. Kennedy, living three miles south of town has on exhibition at the Carrizozo Townsite Company's office samples of the products of his farm all of which were grown without irrigation. Former Santa Fean Now District Attorney at Las Cruces, Successful Prosecutor.

Las Cruces, N. M., Oct. 26.—Mark Thompson, district attorney for the Third judicial district, has gone to Chicago on legal business. Mr. Thompson has won the admiration of the bar and the public for his exceptional ability as a public prosecutor. The criminal cases have all been disposed of for Dona Ana county and only a few minor civil cases remain before the adjournment of court. Many of the civil cases which should have been tried at this term were allowed to go over for lack of funds, it being supposed that the criminal docket would exhaust the court funds. The criminal docket has been so light, however, that had the bar been ready, many of the cases might have been disposed of at this session.

Captain S. F. Woodhull, vice president of the First National Bank of this city, has purchased the Park hotel and has leased the building to Mrs. Grace Thompson, who will conduct an up-to-date hotel.

Las Cruces, Mesilla and surrounding country were visited by a severe hailstorm last night. The hail was in some cases as large as a small hen's egg. The hail was accompanied by a good rain.

James McKenzie, a noted newspaper correspondent and explorer, who has been in Las Cruces some months for his health, having contracted shagbark fever in South America, while acting as a correspondent for the New York Herald, is lying critically ill at this place. Of four companions who contracted the fever with Mr. McKenzie, he is the only survivor.

Gray Dunlap has resigned his position at the Santa Fe railway office and has accepted a position with the Burton Lumber and Hardware company of this place.

The marriage of Rev. George W. Dunlap, pastor of the Presbyterian church here, and Mrs. Katherine Moore, has been announced to take place in November.

HILLSBORO MINE OPERATOR MARRIES

W. C. Purple Weds Mrs. Leona G. Andrews—Other Sierra County News.

Hillsboro, N. M., Oct. 26.—W. C. Purple, who was at one time deputy county recorder of Sierra county, and also interested in the Keystone mine, was married on October 6th. The bride's name was Mrs. Leona G. Andrews of Bradford. The ceremony took place at Jamestown. They will reside at Bradford.

Mrs. Sofia Thompson, mother of W. O. Thompson of this place and of M. O. Thompson of Chloride, died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. James Daylish, at Duran, October 10th. The age of Mrs. Thompson at the time of her death was 90 years and 3 months. Mrs. Thompson was the first white woman to settle at Chloride, having arrived at that place in 1881, with her daughter.

J. M. Webster is in San Diego, California, where he has gone to accompany his wife and son home. They will return next week. This place has been visited by a notable company of ministers who have been looking up their ecclesiastical fences. The Rev. John Morley, representing the Presbyterian church from Albuquerque, Rev. Thomas Harwood, of the M. E. church of the same city and the Rev. W. M. Moberly, of Silver City, were among those who were here.

The county commissioners have been making appropriations to cover most needed public improvements. The contract has been let for the repairing of the court house and improvements to be made on the Kingston and Hillsboro public roads to Palomas and Hot Springs. A new road has been ordered made across the Chichillo mountains, and a fund has been raised by the citizens of precincts five and six to be used in the construction of the new road, the total amount needed being five hundred dollars.
