APRIL SHIPMENTS OF ORANGE BREAK ALL RECORDS. Four Thousand Cars Go Through from California for the East Over the Santa Fe Railway in the Past Month. All records for fruit shipments were smashed again by the Santa Fe in the month of April, four thousand cars of oranges going through from the coast for the eastern markets. This is the largest number of cars of fruit ever taken out of California in one month in the history of the citrus industry. With 284 boxes of oranges to each car, it makes a total of 1,125,600 boxes and with approximately 175 oranges to the box, it means that 248,800,000 oranges were delivered to the eastern markets during one month. This exceeds March shipments by 1,300 cars, and far surpasses any other single month in the history of the road. The value of this enormous amount of fruit will run well up toward \$1,000,000.
