

COUNTERFEIT BILLS ARE IN CIRCULATION

Photographic Reproductions of Some Good Phoenix, Arizona, Money.

"Dickerman's United States Treasury Counterfeit Detector and Bankers' and Merchants' Journal" is a publication which circulates among financial houses and in public offices, one of its chief missions being to guard people against taking counterfeit money and assist in the arrest of those who are passing it. A recent issue just received at the Phoenix postoffice announces that there is in circulation a ten-dollar note which is a counterfeit of a note of that denomination issued by the Phoenix National bank. How extensively this note is in circulation is not known nor the locality where it was discovered, says the Phoenix Republican. So far as known no counterfeit notes have been seen in this section and it is likely they are circulated as far as possible from here. However, it will be interesting to many and perhaps put them on their guard to read the description of the counterfeit as well as that of the genuine bill, as printed by that journal. The counterfeit bill has the check letter C and bears other identifier marks as follows: "W. S. Rosecrans register. (Series 1882) photographic. E. H. Nebecker, treasurer, a poor counterfeit, charter No. 4729, bank No. 1913, treasury number R401967."

The description of a genuine ten dollar note is given by that publication as follows:

"On genuine left end of note vignette represents Franklin, with kite in hand experimenting with electricity with assistant seated on rock near him. Lyden jar in foreground and 1752 in lower left hand corner. Left end vignette represents female of eagle, soaring above clouds and holding lightning in talons. Right end vignette represents DeSoto in covering Mississippi in 1541. All note of this denomination prior to series of 1882 have green border backs, and those of series 1882 have brown border backs, with charter number on back in green panel, center of note. In place of DeSoto vignette. The series of 1902 has portrait of William McKinley on left side of face of note. The number panel is below portrait, large denomination counter in upper right corner and smaller denomination counters in upper and lower left corners. On the back is vignette, female figure and merchant marine. Legend with small denomination counter in center, base of note.

INTERESTING STATISTICS ABOUT ARIZONA

Among the states and territories Arizona ranks third in the production of copper, fifth in silver, and sixth in gold.

In Arizona the males outnumber the females by nearly 20,000.

Males of voting age numbered 44,081, made up of 34,911 whites, 6,534 Indians, 1,546 Mongolians, and 1,094 negroes. There is no danger of the whites losing control when Arizona becomes a state.

The census of 1900 gave the territory only 345 divorced males and 311 divorced females. Widows and widowers were not plentiful—3,972 of the former and 2,988 of the latter.

There is a chance in Arizona for a finely spicered diet. The married men numbered 22,278, of the 94,547 total population over ten years of age, 53,370 were engaged in some kind of gainful occupation, 16,174 of whom were in agriculture, and 16,011 in manufacturing of all kinds, big and little, factory and home industries.

The land area of Arizona is 112,320 square miles, being 400 square miles larger than New Mexico, and 163 square miles larger than the states of Alabama, Arkansas, Connecticut and Delaware combined, and 2,380 square miles larger than the state of Nevada. It is divided into thirteen large counties and one Indian reservation.—Yuma Sentinel.
